

Highbrook, now vested in him as aforesaid, should be transferred to and be vested in the Right Reverend Charles John, now Bishop of Chichester, and his successors in the same bishoprick:

"And whereas the said Charles John, Bishop of Chichester, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the bishop of the diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary he, the said Charles John, Bishop of Chichester, has executed this scheme as hereinafter mentioned.

"And whereas the transfer of the patronage of the said benefice of All Saints, Highbrook, which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the parish or district in or in respect of which the right of patronage or advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say in the new parish of All Saints, Highbrook.

"Now therefore, with the consent of the said Robert Edward Sanderson (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme) and with the consent of the said Charles John, Bishop of Chichester, (in testimony whereof he has signed this scheme and sealed the same with his episcopal seal) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of All Saints, Highbrook, now vested in him, the said Robert Henry Sanderson, as aforesaid, shall be transferred to the said Charles John, Bishop of Chichester, and his successors in the same bishoprick, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Charles John, Bishop of Chichester, and his successors in the same bishoprick for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Chichester.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and thirteen, and of the Act of the seventeenth and eighteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter eighty-four, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the twenty-ninth day of February, in the year one thousand nine hundred and twelve, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and thirteen, and of the Act of the seventeenth and eighteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter eighty-four, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for apportioning the income of the benefice (being a rectory) of Worthen, in the county of Salop and in the diocese of Hereford, between that benefice and a certain other benefice, namely, the benefice (being a rectory) of Hope, which said last named benefice is situate in the said county of Salop and in the said diocese of Hereford.

"Whereas the Warden and Fellows of Saint Mary's College of Winchester, commonly called New College, in Oxford (hereinafter called the patrons), are the patrons of the said benefice of Worthen and also of the said benefice of Hope.

"And whereas it has been made to appear to us that the said benefice of Hope is at present insufficiently endowed, and that the said benefice of Worthen has endowments of such an amount as that after the charge hereinafter recommended and proposed to be made shall have been placed upon the same endowments, the said benefice of Worthen will still be sufficiently endowed.

"And whereas it has been represented to us, and we are of opinion, that it is desirable that additional provision should be made for the cure of souls within the parish of Hope aforesaid, by means of that apportionment of the income of the said benefice of Worthen which is hereinafter recommended and proposed.

"And whereas the said benefice of Worthen is now full.

"Now therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend John, Bishop of Hereford (in testimony whereof he has signed this scheme and sealed the same with his episcopal seal), and with the consent also of the said patrons (in testimony whereof they have caused their common or corporate seal to be affixed to this scheme) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same, and as from the day of the date at which the said benefice of Worthen shall from whatsoever cause be next voided, all the tithe rent charges, glebe lands and all (if any), other the endowments which shall at
