

the said district was named 'The District of Holmside.'

"And whereas by the authority of another Order of Her said late Majesty in Council, bearing date the thirtieth day of August, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-three, and published in the London Gazette on the second day of September in the same year, certain portions of the said Parochial Chapelry of Tanfield, of the District Parish of Collierley, in the said county and diocese, and of the said Parish of Lanchester, were constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes, and the said district was named 'The District of Beamish.'

"And whereas the said District of Holmside, and the said District of Beamish, have become New Parishes of the character contemplated by the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, by the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, and by the above mentioned Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four.

"And whereas by the authority of another Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the eighteenth day of May, in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven, and published in the London Gazette on the twenty-fifth day of the same month, the boundaries of the said New Parish of Holmside and of the said New Parish of Beamish were altered by the annexation to the said New Parish of Beamish of a portion of the said New Parish of Holmside.

"And whereas it has been represented to us, and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said New Parish of Holmside, and of the said New Parish of Beamish, should be further altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned.

"Now therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Handley Carr Glyn, Bishop of the said Diocese of Durham (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme or Representation) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or Representation, and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said New Parish of Holmside, and of the said New Parish of Beamish, shall be altered so that all that portion of the said New Parish of Holmside, which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed, and is thereon coloured pink, shall be dis-severed from such New Parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Beamish.

"And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending or proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

"The territory to be dis-severed from the New Parish of Holmside, in the County of Durham and in the Diocese of Durham, and to be annexed to the New Parish of Beamish, in the same county and diocese, being:—

"All that isolated portion of the said New Parish of Holmside, which forms part of the locality called or known as 'Oxhill' and which is bounded by an imaginary line commencing at the middle of the western end of the bridge which carries the Pontop and South Shields Branch Line of the North Eastern Railway across South Moor Lane, and extending thence southward along the western side of such bridge and along the western side of South Moor Lane (thereby following the boundary of the said New Parish of Beamish) for a distance of twelve chains and a half or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the eastern end of Salisbury Street and extending thence westward along the middle of Salisbury Street, and along a line in continuation thereof (thereby following the boundary of the Consolidated Chapelry of Saint George, South Moor, in the said county and diocese) for a distance of forty-four chains or thereabouts to a point on the eastern side of Shieldrow Lane, upon the boundary of the said New Parish of Beamish, and extending thence first north-eastward and then eastward along the boundary of the said New Parish of Beamish (thereby following in one part the eastern side of Shieldrow Lane and in another part the middle of the said Pontop and South Shields Branch Line of Railway) for a distance of forty-seven chains or thereabouts to the middle of the western end of the bridge which carries such line of railway across South Moor Lane at which point the said imaginary line commenced."

"And whereas drafts of the said Scheme or Representation have been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such Scheme or Representation and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent thereto.

And whereas the said Scheme or Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme or Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts. And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Durham.
