#### NATIONAL INSURANCE ACT, 1911.

(1 & 2 Geo. V., ch. 55.)

Notice is hereby given, under the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that it is proposed by the Insurance Commissioners (England), after the expiration of at least 40 days from this date, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by sections 42 (c) and 65 of the National Insurance Act, 1911, to make regulations as to the sums payable in respect of Deposit Contributors towards the expenses incurred by Insurance Committees in the administration of benefits.

#### MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.

Regulations under Section 9 (1).

COUNTY OF LONDON.

To the London County Council;  
And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), it is enacted that, within any limits or place referred to in Regulations made by Us, the Local Government Board, with a view to the safety of the public, on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour;

And whereas the London County Council having made application to Us to make a Regulation in pursuance of the said sub-section putting the above-mentioned provisions of that sub-section in force within the limits comprising Putney Bridge and High Street, Putney, We directed a Local Inquiry to be held into the matter by one of Our Inspectors, and the Inquiry was held accordingly, and Report has been made to Us thereon:

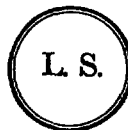
NOW THEREFORE, in pursuance of the powers given to Us in that behalf, We do, by this Our Order, make the following Regulations:—

ARTICLE I.—The provisions of sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Act with respect to the driving of a motor car at a speed not exceeding

ten miles per hour shall apply and have effect within the limits comprising Putney Bridge and High Street, Putney.

ARTICLE II.—These Regulations shall come into operation on the twentieth day of January, one thousand nine hundred and thirteen.

#### MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.

COUNTY OF LONDON.

Whereas by sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903, it is enacted that within any limits or place referred to in Regulations made by the Local Government Board with a view to the safety of the public, on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour;

And whereas the London County Council have made application to the Local Government Board for a Regulation to be made in pursuance of the said sub-section putting the above-mentioned provisions of that sub-section in force within the limits comprising Berkeley Street, Mayfair, and so much of its continuation along the eastern side of Berkeley Square as extends from Berkeley Street to the south side of Bruton Street;

And whereas notice of the said application and of the time and manner in which objections should be made to any such Regulation appeared in the London Gazette of the 1st day of March, 1912, and in the Times of the 1st day of March, 1912;

And whereas certain objections to the making of any Regulation in pursuance of the said provisions have been received by the Local Government Board, and it is expedient that further inquiry should be made in the matter of the said application;

Notice is hereby given, that R. C. Maxwell, Esquire, Barrister-at-Law, one of the Inspectors of the Local Government Board, will attend at the County Hall, Spring Gardens, S.W., on Wednesday, the fifth day of February, 1913, at a quarter past ten o'clock in the forenoon; to hold a Local Inquiry into the subject-matter of the said application.

And notice is hereby further given, that any person interested may attend at such Inquiry and be heard with reference to the said application.
