

additional provision should be made for the cure of souls within the parish of Upper Helmsley with Gate Helmsley aforesaid, by means of that apportionment of the income of the said benefice of Holtby with Warthill which is hereinafter recommended and proposed.

“ And whereas the said benefice of Holtby with Warthill is now full of a Clerk, the Incumbent thereof being the Reverend John Robinson, Clerk in Holy Orders.

“ Now therefore with the consent of the Right Honourable Richard Burdon, Viscount Haldane, acting as Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme) and with the consent of the said Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of York, acting as Ordinary and also as the alternate patron in right of his See of each of the said two benefices as aforesaid (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Archiepiscopal Seal) and also with the consent of the said John Robinson as the Incumbent of the said benefice of Holtby with Warthill (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that as from the day of the date on which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall have been published in the London Gazette and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same, all the pieces or parcels of land, tenements, and hereditaments, being part of the glebe lands belonging to the benefice of Warthill, which are described in the First Schedule to this Scheme annexed and are delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and thereon coloured pink and also the dwelling house known as Warthill Vicarage with its

appurtenances described in the Second Schedule to this Scheme annexed and indicated by green colour on the said map or plan, shall be transferred from the said united benefice of Holtby with Warthill and shall be annexed to and shall in future belong to the said united benefice of Upper Helmsley with Gate Helmsley, provided always and we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, with the consents aforesaid do humbly recommend and propose further that in the event of the said house and its appurtenances described in the said Second Schedule to this Scheme being hereafter sold under the authority of Acts of Parliament authorising the sale of houses of residence or glebe lands belonging to ecclesiastical benefices then one moiety of the net proceeds of such sale shall without any assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same thereupon be transferred to the said united benefice of Holtby with Warthill and shall be held by the person or persons or corporate body to whom such proceeds of sale shall have been paid in trust for the said united benefice of Holtby with Warthill and the Incumbent thereof as an augmentation of the endowments of such benefice.

“ And provided also that the whole of the first fruits and tenths now payable to the Governors of Queen Anne's Bounty in respect of the said united benefice of Holtby with Warthill shall continue to be payable by the Rector or Incumbent of the said benefice.

“ And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament.
