#### NATIONAL INSURANCE ACT, 1911.

(1. & 2 George V, ch. 55.)

Notice is hereby given, pursuant to the provisions of section 113 of the National Insurance Act, 1911, and of the Ninth Schedule to the said Act, that the Joint Committee of the several bodies of Commissioners appointed for the purposes of Part I of the said Act, and the Insurance Commissioners constituted under the said Act, acting jointly, propose to make a Special Order under Part II (i) of the First Schedule to the said Act, specifying the following class of employment as being of such a nature that it is ordinarily adopted as subsidiary employment only, and not as the principal means of livelihood, viz., employment by a local or other public authority in the removing of snow in or about any streets or other public places, where the person so employed is not otherwise ordinarily employed by that authority.

#### MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.

Regulations under Section 9 (1):

COUNTY OF ESSEX.

URBAN DISTRICT OF WITHAM.

To the County Council of Essex;—  
And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), it is enacted that, within any limits or place referred to in Regulations made by Us, the Local Government Board, with a view to the safety of the public, on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour;
