

Potovens Lane across the line of the West Yorkshire Railway (Great Northern Railway), and extending thence north-westward in a straight line for a distance of forty-eight chains or thereabouts to the junction of Lawns Lane with the roadway and footpath leading past the northern side of the house called Elm Villa into the Bradford Road, and extending thence first westward, then north-westward and then again westward along the middle of the said roadway and footpath (thereby crossing the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Mary Magdalene, Outwood, from the said Parish of East Ardsley) for a distance of twenty chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with the Bradford Road, and extending thence south-westward in a straight line for a distance of twenty-nine chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the northern end of the footpath which leads from Stony Lane to Beck Bottom Road, and extending thence westward in a straight line (thereby passing to the south of Woodhouse Hall) for a distance of forty-two chains and a half or thereabouts to the junction of Woodhouse Lane with the footpath leading past the Woodhouse Lane Quarry to Nooking, and extending thence south-westward in a straight line (thereby crossing Blind Lane) for a distance of thirty-nine chains or thereabouts to the centre of the culvert which carries the road leading from West Ardsley to Alverthorpe across the stream called Carrgate Beck, upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of East Ardsley from the said Parish of West Ardsley.

"The Third Schedule.

"The territory to be dis severed from the said New Parish of Saint Mary Magdalene, Outwood, and to be annexed to the said New Parish of Saint John, Wakefield, being:—

"All that portion of the said New Parish of Saint Mary Magdalene, Outwood, which is bounded upon the east by the New Parish of Stanley, in the said County and Diocese, upon the south partly by the last named New Parish and partly by the said New Parish of Saint John, Wakefield, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the west and upon the north, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint John, Wakefield, from the said New Parish of Saint Mary Magdalene, Outwood, at a point in the middle of Red Hall Lane distant five chains precisely measured along the middle of such lane from its junction with the Bradford Road, and extending thence in a straight line due north for a distance of six chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the stream called Snow Hill Beck, and extending thence first eastward, then north-eastward and then northward along the middle of such stream for a distance of twenty-seven chains or thereabouts to the point where it meets the fence forming the northern boundary of the close numbered 1 upon the map or plan annexed to this Scheme or Representation, and extending thence first north-eastward, then south-eastward and then eastward along the said fence and along the fences forming the eastern boundary of the said close and the northern boundary of the close numbered 2 upon the said map or plan for a distance in all of nineteen chains or there-

abouts to the eastern end of the last mentioned fence on the western side of Newton Lane, and extending thence in a straight line due east (thereby crossing Newton Lane and the close numbered 3 upon the said map or plan) for a distance of seven chains or thereabouts to the fence forming the eastern boundary of the last mentioned close, and extending thence first southward along such fence and then south-eastward along the fences forming the northern boundaries of the closes numbered 4, 5 and 6 upon the said map or plan (thereby crossing the footpath leading from Ouchthorpe Lane into Newton Lane) for a distance of nineteen chains or thereabouts to the point where the last mentioned fence meets the footpath leading from the last described footpath into Ouchthorpe Lane near the houses known as Field Head, and extending thence first south-eastward and then north-eastward along the middle of such footpath for a distance of sixteen chains or thereabouts to the point, near its junction with the footpath leading past the western side of Field Head, where it is crossed by the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Mary Magdalene, Outwood, from the said New Parish of Stanley."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme or Representation have been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such Scheme or Representation and such Patrons and Incumbents have either signified their assent or offered no objections thereto.

And whereas a period of more than one calendar month has elapsed since drafts of the said Scheme or Representation were transmitted to the said Patrons and Incumbents.

And whereas the said Scheme or Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme or Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts. And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Wakefield.
