

of the bridge which carries the Shipley Branch Line of the said railway across the said Leeds, Bradford and Halifax line of railway; and extending thence first north-eastward, and then north-westward along the middle of the said Shipley Branch line of railway (thereby crossing the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Mary, Laister Dyke, from the said parish of Calverley) for a distance of one mile and seventeen chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries such line of railway across Woodhall Road, upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Calverley from the said new parish of Saint Mary, Laister Dyke, and extending thence first northward and then south-westward along the last mentioned boundary (thereby following in part the middle of Woodhall Road and in part the middle of Fagley Road) for a distance of seventeen chains or thereabouts to the point in the middle of the stream called Fagley Beck, where such boundary meets the boundary of the said new parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Greengates."

And whereas the said Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts. And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Ripon.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

**W**HEREAS by an Order made by the late King's Most Excellent Majesty in Council, on the 19th March, 1908, His Majesty was pleased to order (amongst other things) that, where any property belonging to or held

for the benefit of a unit of Volunteers or Yeomanry mentioned in the first column of the Schedule to that Order was vested in or held by any Trustees other than the Commanding Officer of such unit, those Trustees should, until otherwise directed by Order in Council, under section 29 of the Territorial and Reserve Forces Act, 1907, be appointed in regard to the property so vested in or held by them to be special Trustees, to the exclusion of the Association, and should continue to hold such property in trust for the corresponding unit of the Territorial Force in like manner in all respects as they previously held it for the unit of the Volunteers or Yeomanry, and that the corresponding unit should, notwithstanding any trust, limitation, or condition affecting any such property, continue entitled to the benefit thereof in like manner as the unit was entitled thereto before it became a unit of the Territorial Force.

And whereas by virtue of the above-recited provisions of the said Order in Council the Trustees named in the first column of the Schedule to this Order hold the properties described and set opposite to their names in the second column of that Schedule in trust for the unit of the Territorial Force mentioned in the third column of that Schedule for the purposes and subject to the limitations mentioned in the deeds (if any) referred to in the fourth column of that Schedule, and it is expedient that such properties should be transferred from those Trustees to the County Association mentioned in the fifth column of that Schedule.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that as from the date of this Order the said properties shall in each case be by virtue of this Order transferred from the said Trustees to and vested in the said County Association, subject to any charges thereon and to any liabilities in or towards the discharge of which the said properties are properly applicable, and shall be held by the said Association in like manner in all respects as they were held by the said Trustees respectively for the benefit of the said unit of the Territorial Force or for such other purposes as the Association, with the consent of the said unit (to be ascertained in manner prescribed by regulations of the Army Council), shall direct, but so that the interest of any beneficiaries other than the said unit or the unit of the Volunteers or Yeomanry with which it corresponds shall not, without the consent of such beneficiaries, be affected.
