MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.

COUNTY OF SURREY.

Whereas by sub-section 1 of section 9 of the
Motor Car Act, 1903, it is enacted that
within any limits or place referred in regula-
tions made by the Local Government Board
with a view to the safety of the public, on the
application of the local authority of the area
in which the limit or place are situate, a person
shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceed-
ing ten miles per hour:

Notice is hereby given, that the County
Council of Surrey have made application to the
Local Government Board for a regulation to be
made in pursuance of the said sub-section
putting the above-mentioned provisions of that
sub-section in force within the limits compris-
ing High Street, Egham, from a point opposite
the western extremity of the Baptist Chapel at

the Glanty to a point opposite the western ex-
tremity of the Police Station at the foot of
Egham Hill:

tions to the making of any such regulation

**ORDER OF THE BOARD OF
AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.**

(DATED 4TH MARCH 1913.)

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by
virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in
them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894
to 1911, and of every other power enabling
them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby
ordered, as follows:

1. The date on which Chapter I. (*Importa-
tion*) of the Horses (Importation and Transit)
Order of 1912 (hereinafter referred to as the
principal Order) shall come into operation is
hereby further altered to the first day of July,
nineteen hundred and thirteen.

2. The provisions of paragraph (ix.) (*Food
and Water*) of Article 13 of the principal Order
shall not, until the first day of July, nineteen
hundred and thirteen, apply to a vessel on
which horses, asses, or mules are carried to any
port in Great Britain or from any such port to
any port in the British Islands.

3. The first day of July, nineteen hundred
and thirteen, shall be substituted for the first
day of January, nineteen hundred and
thirteen, in the Schedule to the principal
Order (*Orders Revoked*).

and thirteen.
