WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in consideration of a benefaction consisting of a certain house and premises, which have been permanently secured by deed dated the third day of February, in the year one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, as a parsonage or house of residence for the vicarage of The Annunciation, Chislehurst, in the county of Kent and in the diocese of Rochester, do hereby, in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and eleven, section five, grant out of our common fund to the said vicarage of The Annunciation, Chislehurst, to meet such benefaction one capital sum of one thousand pounds, in respect of which so long as the same capital sum, or any part thereof, shall remain in our hands, there shall be paid by us to the Incumbent for the time being of the said vicarage one yearly sum of thirty pounds, or such part thereof as shall be proportionate to any balance of the same capital sum which shall so remain in our hands, the above-mentioned yearly payment to commence as from the thirteenth day of February, in the year one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, and to be receivable in equal quarterly portions on the first day of February, the first day of

May, the first day of August, and on the first day of November, in each and every year.

In witness whereof, we have hereunto set our common seal, this twenty-seventh day of February, in the year one thousand nine hundred and thirteen.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her late Majesty, Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and eleven, section five, do hereby, subject as hereinafter mentioned, grant and convey to the Incumbent of the vicarage of Clare, in the county of Suffolk and in the diocese of Ely, and to his successors, Incumbents of the same vicarage, all and singular, the yearly tithe commutation rentcharges particularly described in the Schedule hereunto annexed, and now vested in us, to have and to hold the said yearly tithe commutation rentcharges to the use of the said Incumbent and his successors for ever: Provided always, that the Incumbent for the time being of the same vicarage shall be entitled to receive from us, or on our account, the net amount of the rents, profits and proceeds of the said yearly tithe commutation rentcharges for and in respect of the period intervening between the first day of October, in the year one thousand nine hundred and twelve, and the date of the publication of these Presents in the London Gazette.
