**MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.
COUNTY OF SURREY.**

Whereas by sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903, it is enacted that within any limits or place referred to in regulations made by the Local Government Board with a view to the safety of the public, on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour.

And whereas by sub-section (3) of the said section the Local Government Board are empowered to revoke or alter any regulations made by them under the said section:

And whereas the County Council of Surrey have made application to the Local Government Board for a regulation to be made in pursuance of sub-section (1) of section 9 aforesaid putting the above-mentioned provisions of that sub-section in force within the limits comprising the following parts of roads within the Urban District of Barnes, that is to say:—

So much of the Lower Richmond Road, Mortlake, as extends from a point 30 yards west of its junction with Rosemary Terrace to its junction with Sheen Lane;

So much of High Street, Mortlake, as extends from its junction with Sheen Lane to the east side of Bull's Alley; and

So much of Sheen Lane, Mortlake, as extends from its junction with Lower Richmond Road to a point 30 yards south of the level crossing at Mortlake Station;

And whereas by an Order dated the 23rd day of March, 1908, regulations were made by the Local Government Board whereby the above-mentioned provisions of sub-section (1) of the said section were applied, and accordingly have effect within certain limits, including Church Road, Barnes, from its junction with High Street to the Red Lion Public House at Castlenau:

And whereas it has been represented to the Local Government Board that the regulations last above recited, so far as they relate to Church Road aforesaid, should be revoked:

Notice is hereby given, that R. C. Maxwell, Esquire, Barrister-at-Law, one of the Inspectors of the Local Government Board, will attend at the offices of the Urban District Council of Barnes, Mortlake, on Monday, the 31st day of March, 1913, at 3 o'clock in the afternoon, to hold a Local Inquiry into the matters aforesaid, when and where all persons interested may attend and be heard with reference to the subject of the Inquiry.
