From Lisbonne we are informed that the Cortes or Three Estates of Portugal had confirmed the Prince Don Pedra in the Sovernment and Regency of that Kingdom, and in column manner lyorn Obedience to him accordingly; the Ceremony being performed in the Great Hall of the Pallaces, where the Prince was leaved upon a Throne railed fome few sleps above the felt the Duke de Cadava! standing at his Right Hand with the Sword drawn, the Prince took first 2 Solemn Oath for the Government of that Kingdom according to the Island Euston's and Priviletges; the Ceremony ending with an Excelent Speech pronounced on that Occasion by Don Fedro Fernando Montegro, Principal Secretary of State. The Queen has reloived for the future nor to accept of any other Title but that of Prin-

Bruffels , Aug. 17. On Saturday last his Excellency the Marquils de Castel Rodrigo named several persons to be fent into Burgundy as Commissioners, to take informations concerning all such persons as being Members of the Parliament of Dole about the time of the late-French Inva-Bon of that County, had so far forgotten their Allegeance to His Catholick Majesty, as that they are more than suspe-Eted to have largely contributed towards the Conquest. The Persons at present nominated are Monsieur Simon, President of the Provincial Council of Arthois, Monsieur Coezell, one of the Members of the Grand Council, and Monsteur Vass, one of His Catholick Majesties Advocates 'Tis believed in the Provincial Council of Flanders. that the greatest part of the Parliament will be found to have been defective in their Duties and Allegeance to the King of Spain, only 3 of them having at present cleared themfelves from that suspition, by their timely Protestations against what the rest of the said Parliment voted in savour to the French interest, and refusing to sign the Capitulations ag ced upon for a furtender. These Commissions are now iffuing out with all convenient speed, under His Catholick Majesties Great Seal, and their Instructions prepared, 'tis faid with full power to make fuch changes as they find convenient for the fettlement of that County.

The Prince of Aremberg has been lately at Nancy of where he has made an agreement for the Entertainment of fuch fortes of the Duke of Lorrain as shall enter themselves into the Spanish Service, for the present security of Franche Comte.

His Electoral Highness of Cologne has dismissed a considerable part of his forces. It is believed his Excellency the Marquiss de Castel Rodrigo may prevail with the said Elecctor to lend 2 or 3 thousand of them, such as the Marquis shall make choice of, to march likewise into Franche Com-## ; where are already arrived a party of about 500 of them; and entred into the Spanish Service.
