The KING Commands that the Court shall wear Mourning from this day for Four Weeks, for His late Majesty The King of the Hellenes, K.G., G.C.V.O., Uncle of His Majesty, and Brother of Her Majesty Queen Alexandra, viz.:—

The Ladies to wear black Dresses, white Gloves, black or white Shoes, Feathers, and Fans, Pearls, Diamonds, or plain gold or silver Ornaments.

The Gentlemen to wear Crepe Band on Left Arm in Uniform or Court Dress.

The Court to change to Half Mourning on Wednesday, the 9th April next, viz.:—
The Ladies to wear black Dresses, with coloured Ribbons, Flowers, Feathers and Ornaments, or grey or white Dresses, with black Ribbons, Flowers, Feathers and Ornaments.

The Gentlemen to continue the same Mourning.

And on Wednesday, the 16th April next, the Court to go out of Mourning.

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
