## ALTERING GENERAL CONSOLIDATED ORDER: Appointment of Nurses.

## PARISH OF BRISTOL.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Parish of Bristol;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by a General Order (hereinafter referred to as "the General Consolidated Order") dated the 24th day of July, 1847, and addressed to the Guardians of the Poor of the several Unions named in the Schedule thereunto annexed, the Poor Law Commissioners made certain Regulations applicable to the government of the Workhouse of each of those Unions;

And whereas by Article 153 of the General Consolidated Order provision was made for the appointment by the Guardians of persons to hold certain offices in the Workhouse, including the office of Nurse, and by Articles 155 and 172 of the General Consolidated Order it was further directed that every such appointment should be reported to the Poor Law Commissioners, and that the Guardians should pay to the officers so appointed such salaries or remuneration as the said Commissioners might from time to time direct or approve;

And, whereas the General Consolidated Order is applicable to and in force in the Parish of Bristol;

And whereas it is expedient that further provision should be made with regard to the appointment of persons to hold the office of Nurse in the Workhouses of the said Parish:

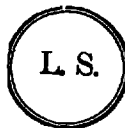
NOW THEREFORE, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby Order and Direct that, notwithstanding anything contained in the General Consolidated Order, as applicable as aforesaid to the Parish of Bristol, if the Guardians of the Poor of the said Parish shall submit to Us for Our approval a statement showing the total numbers of persons which the said Guardians consider it necessary to appoint to hold the office of Nurse at each of the Workhouses of the said Parish respectively, and the salaries or scales of salaries to be assigned to those Nurses, and We approve that statement, it shall not be necessary for the said Guardians to report to Us each appointment under the General Consolidated Order of a person to hold the office of Nurse in either of the said Workhouses, nor to obtain Our approval to the remuneration of any person so appointed, so long as the numbers of persons so appointed in relation to each of the said Workhouses and their salaries do not exceed the numbers of persons and the scales of salaries shown in the said statement and approved by Us:

Provided as follows—

(1) This Order shall not apply to the appointment of any Superintendent Nurse appointed subject to the provisions of the Nursing in Workhouses Order, 1897.

(2) A person who has not reached the age of twenty-one years shall not be employed in the capacity of Probationary Nurse.

## MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.

## COUNTY OF LONDON.

Whereas by sub-section 1 of Section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903, it is enacted that within any limits or place referred to in regulations made by the Local Government Board with a
