said Parish of Checkley, and annexed for Ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of Croxden.

1 "That the Consecrated Church or Chapel of Ease of St. John the Evangelist shall cease to be a Chapel of Ease to the Church of the Parish of Checkley, and shall become and be a Chapel of Ease to the Church of the Parish of Croxden for the use of the parishioners and inhabitants

"That the parishioners and inhabitants of the Parish of Checkley shall cease to be entitled to accommodation in the said Consecrated Church or Chapel of St. John the Evangelist, Hollington, and to all rights of baptism, marriage, churching, or burial therein (if any), hitherto possessed or enjoyed by them therein. That a district consisting of all those detached and outlying portions of the said Parish of Checkley, which are more particularly described in the second part of the said Schedule, hereto, and together with the boundaries thereof are more particularly delineated and set forth on the said map or plan hereunto annexed, and thereon coloured Blue, shall be separated from the said Parish of Checkley and annexed for Ecclesiastical purposes to the said Parish of Stramshall.

"That a district consisting of all that detached portion of the said Parish of Stramshall which is more particularly described in the third part of the said Schedule hereto, and together with the boundaries thereof is more particularly delineated and set forth on the said map or plan hereunto annexed, and thereon coloured Yellow, shall be separated from the said Parish of Stramshall, and annexed for Ecclesiastical purposes to the said Parish of Croxden.

"That the Incumbents of the said Parishes to which such districts shall respectively be annexed shall have the sole and exclusive cure of souls within such districts respectively.

That the inhabitants of such districts shall respectively be entitled to accommodation in the Parish Church and Chapel of Ease of the Parish to which such districts shall respectively be annexed, but shall cease to be entitled to accommodation in the Church of the Parish from which the same shall respectively have been separated.

"That marriages, baptisms, churchings and burials for the inhabitants of such districts shall be solemnized and performed in the Church of the Parish to which the district where such inhabitants reside shall be annexed, or in the Chapel of Ease (if any) of such Parish, so far as the same may be lawfully solemnized and performed therein, but not further or otherwise, and all fees, dues, ecclesiastical offerings and emoluments (except tithe rent charge) arising from such districts shall hereafter belong to the Incumbent of the Parish to which the district whence the same arises shall be annexed.

"That there shall be paid to the Vicar or Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Croxden by the Rector or Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Checkley out of the tithe, tithe rent charge, glebe lands, and other revenues of the said Rectory of Checkley an annual rent or yearly sum of one hundred and fifty pounds, to be charged upon and payable out of the said tithes, tithe rent charge, glebe lands, and other revenues of the said Rectory of Checkley, and to be payable by half-yearly payments, the first half-yearly payment to become due and be paid at the expiration of six calendar months from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of His Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme.

"That, except as aforesaid, no alteration shall be made in the endowments of the said

Benefices or any of them.

"That no alteration shall be made in the patronage of the said Benefices or any of them.

"SCHEDULE.

"FIRST PART:

"The district to be separated from the Parish of Checkley, in the County of Stafford and the Diocese of Lichfield, and to be annexed to the Parish of Croxden, in the same County and Diocese:

"All that portion of the Parish of Checkley, in the County of Stafford and in the Diocese of Lichfield, which is verged Red on the aforesaid map or plan, and is bounded on or towards the north partly by the New Parish of Freehay and partly by the Parish of Croxden on or towards the north-east, partly by the said Parish of Croxden, and partly by a detached portion of the Parish of Uttoxeter, and on or towards the south-east by the new Parish of Stramshall, and on or towards the south-west by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Checkley from the said New Parish of Freehay at the point marked 'A' where the said boundary intersects the middle of the road from Cheadle Common to Hollington, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the said road for a distance of 107 chains or thereabouts to the point marked 'B' where the said road meets an occupation road leading in the direction of Overton, and extending thence southward along the middle of the said occupation road for a distance of 35 chains or thereabouts to the point marked, 'C' where the said road meets the footpath to Overton, and extending thence southward along the middle of the said footpath for a distance of 15 chains or thereabouts to the point marked 'D' where the said footpath meets the middle of the road leading from the Checkley and Hollington road to Broadgate Hall, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the said road for a distance of 13 chains or thereabouts to the point marked 'E' where the said road meets the middle of the said Checkley and Hollington road, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of a footpath leading from the said last-mentioned road in the direction of Madeley Farm for a distance of 30 chains or thereabouts to the point marked 'F,' where the said footpath meets an occupation road leading in the direction of Hollington Fields, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the said occupation road for a distance of 10 chains or thereabouts to the point marked 'G,' where the said road meets the road leading from the Checkley and Hollington road to Oldwood, and extending thence first south-eastward and then eastward along the middle of the said road for a distance of 17 chains or thereabouts to the point marked 'H,' where the said road meets a footpath leading from Oldwood to the main road from Uttoxeter to Newcastle, and extending thence
