And whereas the Local Government Board, after giving to the Incumbent and the churchwardens of the parish of All Cannings, in the county of Wilts, ten days' previous notice of their intention in that behalf, have made a representation to His Majesty in Council that, for the protection of the public health, the opening of any new burial ground in the civil parish of All Cannings, in the county of Wilts, save with the previous approval of the Local Government Board, should be prohibited, and that burials should be discontinued in the said parish as hereinafter directed:

And whereas His Majesty was pleased, by His Order in Council of the 11th day of February last, to give notice of such representation, and to order that the same should be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council, on the 17th day of March, 1913, and such Order has been published in the London Gazette and copies thereof have been affixed, as required by the said Act:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, as it is hereby ordered, that no new burial ground shall be opened in the said civil parish save with the previous approval of the Local Government Board, and that burials in the said parish shall be discontinued as follows, viz. :—

All Cannings.—Forthwith and entirely in the parish church of Saint Anne, All Cannings, in the county of Wilts; and in the churchyard, except as follows:—

(a) In any vault or walled grave now existing in the said churchyard burial may be allowed subject to the condition that every coffin buried in such vault or grave be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

(b) In any earthen grave now existing in the said churchyard the burial may be allowed of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such grave, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.
