NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE.

The National Health Insurance (Wales) (Transfer of Deposit Contributors) Order, 1913, dated 22nd April, 1913, made by the Welsh Insurance Commissioners under Sections 78 and 82 of the National Insurance Act, 1911 (1 & 2 Geo. 5, c. 55).

Whereas by Section 78 of the National Insurance Act, 1911 (in this Order called "the Act"), read with Section 82 of the Act, it is amongst other things provided that if any difficulty arises in respect of bringing into operation in Wales Part I. of the Act the Welsh Insurance Commissioners with the consent of the Treasury may, by Order, do anything which appears to them necessary or expedient for bringing that Part of the Act into operation in Wales, and that any such Order may modify the provisions of the Act so far as may appear necessary or expedient for carrying the Order into effect:

And whereas by subsection (2) of Section 43 of the Act it is provided that if a deposit contributor becomes a member of an Approved Society there shall be transferred to the Society the amount standing to his credit in the Post Office Fund, but that (a) if that amount exceeds the value of the contributions paid by or in respect of him, estimated on the assumption that he had been a member of an Approved Society since his entry into insurance, the ex-
