The Secretary of State for the Home Department, on the application of the London County Council, has granted a Certificate under the provisions of the Children Act, 1908 (8 Edw. 7, cap. 67), for the premises known as Gisburne House, Watford, in the county of Hertford, with a view to the reception therein of girls committed to an Industrial School in pursuance of the Children Act or of the Elementary Education Act, 1876 (39 and 40 Vic., cap. 79).

The Certificate, which bears date the 29th May, 1913, provides that the number of girls resident in the school at any one time, whether committed in pursuance of the provisions of the above-mentioned Acts or not, shall not exceed fifty-seven.

The Wild Birds Protection (County of Aberdeen) Order, 1913.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1908, and upon application by the County Council of the County of Aberdeen, I, the Right Honourable Thomas McKinnon Wood, His Majesty's Secretary for Scotland, do hereby make the following Order:

1. The whole of the county of Aberdeen is
