MERSEY CONSERVANCY ACT.

I hereby give notice, pursuant to the 9th section of the Act 5 and 6 Victoria, cap. 110, intituled "An Act for better preserving the Naziration of the Birm of the Preserving the Preserving and the Preserving the Pres Navigation of the River Mersey," that I have received a notice from Messrs. Joseph Crosfield and Sons, Limited, Warrington, given pursuant to the provisions of the above mentioned Act, of their intention to construct in Warrington and in Walton Inferior a Transporter Bridge across the River Mersey, in accordance with plans and sections deposited at this office, a copy of which notice is subjoined.

In pursuance of an Act for better preserving the navigation of the River Mersey (5 and 6 Victoria, cap. CX.), we, Joseph Crossield and Sons, Limited, Bank Quay, Warrington, Soap and Chemical Manufacturers, hereby give you notice that we propose to construct in Warrington, in the County Palatine of Lancaster, and in Walton Inferior, in the County Palatine of Chester, in accordance with plans and sections deposited at the office of the Mersey Conservancy in Westminster, a Transporter Bridge across the River Mersey, of the form, nature, and extent shown on the plans and sections aforesaid.

The Transporter Bridge will be constructed and erected on a line which will be at or about a right angle to the line of the River Mersey, and the situation of the centre line of the bridge will be, on the easterly (or Warrington) side of the River Mersey, at a distance of 28 feet (measured in a southerly direction) from the south-westerly corner of the fence belonging to the St. Helens Cable and Rubber Company, Limited, and on the westerly (or Walton Inferior) side, near the centre of the timber wharf which was erected by and which belongs to us, Joseph Crosfield and Sons, Limited.

The object of the Transporter Bridge is to provide communication between works and factories belonging to and occupied by us on the two sides of the River Mersey. The abutments of the bridge will be constructed of brickwork and concrete, and the superstruc-ture will be of steel. The abutment on the easterly (or Warrington) side will project into the tidal waters of the River Mersey to the extent of 32 feet (measured from the line of high water on the Lancashire side of the river), and the abutment on the westerly (or Walton Inferior) side will project into these tidal waters to the extent of 33 feet (measured from the line of high water on the Cheshire side of the river).

The abutments of the bridge will exclude about 1,390 cubic yards of tidal water on a tide of the height of 21 feet, as measured from the level of the top of the sill of the Old Dock Gates in Liverpool. No other part or parts of the bridge will exclude tidal waters.

The work required for the construction of the Transporter Bridge will be commenced on or after the expiry of two calendar months from the date of this notice.

ARTICLE I.—The provisions of subsection (1) of section 9 of the Act with respect to the driving of a motor car at a speed not exceeding ten miles per hour, shall apply and have effect within the limits comprising the roads or parts of roads at Princes Kisborough which are specified in the Schedule hereto.

ARTICLE II.—These Regulations shall come into operation on the ninth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and thirteen.

SCHEDULE.

So much of the Thame Road as extends for a distance of 35 yards from its junction with the Aylesbury Road; and

(DATED 4TH JUNE 1913.)

BOSTON (PARK LANE ALLOTMENTS) (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF 1913.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1911, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Premises to which this Order applies.

- 1.—(1.) This Order shall apply to the premises described in the Schedule hereto, and also to any other premises in the borough of Boston to which the Order may be applied by a Notice to that effect signed by an Inspector of the Board or of the Local Authority of the said borough and served upon the occupier of the premises described in such Notice.
- (2.) This Order shall cease to apply to any premises upon service on the occupier thereof of a Notice to that effect signed by an Inspector of the Board.

(3.) A copy of every Notice served under this Article shall forthwith be sent to the Board by the Inspector signing the same.

Restrictions on Movement of Swine from or to Premises to which this Order applies.

2. Swine shall not, except as expressly authorised by this Order, be moved from or to any premises to which this Order applies.

Movement of Swine for Immediate Slaughter.

- 3.—(1.) Swine (not being in a Swine-Fever Infected Place and their movement not being prohibited by Notice of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board given under any Order of the Board) may be moved from any premises to which this Order applies to a slaughter-house situate in the administrative county of the Parts of Holland Division of Lincolnshire for the purpose of immediate slaughter if accompanied by a licence in the Form D set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 authorising such movement, granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the borough of Boston, which licence shall be in force for not more than eight days inclusive of the day of issue.
- (2.) Before a licence is granted by an Inspector under this Article the owner of the swine, or his agent authorised in writing for this purpose, shall sign, and deliver or send by post to the Inspector, a declaration in the Form E set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, which shall be retained by the Inspector.
- (3.) The swine shall, before the movement is commenced, be marked by and at the expense of the owner by the painting with an indelible composition of red colour of a broad line down the back and another broad line across the loins of each of the swine thus +, each line being not less than nine inches long.
- (4.) The swine moved under this Article shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay, and shall, after their arrival at the slaughter-house, be there detained until they are slaughtered.
- (5.) During the movement the swine shall not be permitted to come in contact with swine not marked in manner prescribed by this Article.

Cleansing and Disinfection of Vehicles used for Conveyance of Swine.

- 4.—(1.) Any float, cart or van which has been used for the conveyance of swine under the preceding Article shall immediately after each occasion of such use be cleansed and disinfected by and at the expense of the person using the same for such purpose as follows:
 - (i.) The floor of the float, cart or van and all other parts thereof with which the swine, or their droppings, have come in contact shall be scraped and swept, and the scrapings and sweepings, and all dung, sawdust, litter, and other matter shall be effectually removed therefrom; then

- (ii.) The same parts of the float, cart or van shall be thoroughly washed or scrubbed or scoured with water; then
- (iii.) The same parts of the float, cart or van shall be disinfected in one of the modes prescribed by the Diseases of Animals (Disinfection) Order of 1906.
- (2.) The scrapings and sweepings, and the dung, sawdust, litter, and other matter removed under this Article shall forthwith be well mixed with quicklime, and be effectually removed from contact with swine.

Movement of Swine to Premises to which this Order applies.

- 5.—(1.) Swine may be moved to any premises to which this Order applies, if accompanied by a licence in the Form A set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 authorising such movement, granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the borough of Boston, under this Order or under the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, as the case may be. The licence shall be in force for not more than eight days inclusive of the day of issue.
- (2.) Before a licence is granted by an Inspector under this Article the owner of the swine, or his agent authorised in writing for this purpose, shall sign, and deliver or send by post to the Inspector, a declaration in the Form B set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, countersigned as hereinafter provided.
- (3.) The declaration shall not be effective until it is countersigned by a police officer of the district where the swine are, who, before countersigning the declaration, shall, so far as is practicable, satisfy himself as to the correctness of the statements contained therein.
- (4.) The declaration shall be retained by the Inspector granting the licence thereon.
- (5.) The swine moved under this Article shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay.
- (6.) Swine while detained on premises to which this Order applies need not be kept separate from other swine.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

- 6.—(1.) Any person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the licence, if any, necessary for the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.
- (2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

Licences after Completion of Movement.

7. A licence under this Order authorising movement of swine to any premises shall forthwith after completion of the movement be

delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station in the same District by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing the movement.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

8. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

- 9.—(1.) If a pig is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the pig, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the pig is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (2.) If a pig is not marked as required by this Order, the owner, consignee, or other person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (3.) If any person, with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order, by washing, or in any other manner, takes out, effaces, or obliterates, or attempts to take out, efface, or obliterate, any mark painted on any pig as required by this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of
- (4.) If a person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Interpretation.

10. In this Order—

- "The Act of 1894" means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894:
- "The Board" means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries:
- "Swine-Fever Infected Place" means a place for the time being declared to be a Swine-Fever Infected Place under any Order of the Board:
- "Slaughter-house" includes bacon-factory. Other terms have the same meaning as in the \mathbf{A} ct of 1894.

Commencement.

11. This Order shall come into operation on the tenth day of June, nineteen hundred and thirteen.
