The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1911, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, hereby define as a Foreign Animals Quarantine Station for the purposes of the Foreign Animals (Quarantine) Order of 1896, and for the specific purpose of the landing of the animal described in the Schedule hereto, the following part of the premises at Folkestone Harbour in the occupation of the South-Eastern and Chatham Railway Company, that is to say:

Such portion of the said premises as is selected as suitable for the purpose of this Order by a Veterinary Inspector of the Board.

This Order shall operate immediately after the landing of the animal, and shall cease to operate so soon as the animal has been moved by Licence of a Veterinary Inspector of the Board out of the Quarantine Station, and the Quarantine Station has been cleansed and disinfected to the satisfaction of the Inspector.
