ORDER OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL IN ENGLAND.

(Dated 11th June, 1913.)

Whereas by the 21st section of the Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1874, it is enacted that the Registrar-General, with the sanction of the Local Government Board, may from time to time alter Registration Sub-districts:—

1. And whereas it is expedient in order that Wincanton Registration District may consist of two Sub-districts co-extensive respectively with the recently constituted Relief Districts of Wincanton Poor Law Union, (1) that Milborne Port Sub-district of that Registration District should be abolished, and its constituent Civil Parishes added to the two remaining Sub-districts of that Registration District as follows, viz.:—

(a) Blackford, and Maperton Civil Parishes to Castle Cary Sub-district; and

(b) Abbas and Temple Combe, Charlton Horethorne, Henstridge, Holton, Horsington, Milborne Port, North Cheriton, and Stowell Civil Parishes to Wincanton Subdistrict; and (2) that the Civil Parishes of Bruton, and Shepton Montague should be transferred from Wincanton Sub-district to Castle Cary Sub-district.

2. Now, therefore, I, Bernard Mallet, C.B., Registrar-General of Births, Deaths, and Marriages in England, in exercise of the powers given me by the above mentioned Act, and with the sanction of the Local Government Board, do hereby order and declare that the foregoing alteration shall take effect accordingly.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of July, nineteen hundred and thirteen. Witness my hand this eleventh day of June, nineteen hundred and thirteen.
