## PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and thirteen, and of the Act of the seventeenth and eighteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter eighty-four, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the eighth day of May, in the year one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and thirteen, and of the Act of the seventeenth and eighteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter eighty-four, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for apportioning the income of the benefice (being a vicarage) of Saint Andrew, Great Grimsby, in the county

of Lincoln and in the diocese of Lincoln, between that benefice and a certain other benefice, namely, the benefice (being a consolidated chapelry) of Saint Luke, Grimsby, which said last-named benefice is situate in the said county of Lincoln and in the said diocese of Lincoln.

"Whereas the Bishop of the said diocese of Lincoln is the patron in right of his See of the said benefice of Saint Andrew, Great Grimsby, and also of the said benefice of Saint Luke, Grimsby.

"And whereas by the authority of an Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the thirteenth day of October, in the year one thousand nine hundred and ten, and published in the London Gazette on the twenty-first day of the same month, all the tithe rent charges, glebe lands, and all (if any) other the endowments then or thereafter belonging to the benefice of Algarkirk, in the said county of Lincoln and in the said diocese of Lincoln, were charged and for ever made chargeable as from the day of the date on which such Order was published in the London Gazette with a clear annual sum or yearly charge of eighty pounds in favour of the Incumbent of the said benefice of Saint Andrew, Great Grimsby, and his successors.

"And whereas we are of opinion that the said benefice of Saint Luke, Grimsby, is at
