

"And whereas we have made due inquiry and calculation as to the circumstances and relative value of the said two benefices and of the patronage thereof respectively, and we do hereby certify to Your Majesty in Council that the circumstances and present values of the said two benefices are as set forth in the Schedule hereunto annexed.

"And whereas the yearly value of the said benefice of Limber Magna in Your Majesty's books is nine pounds eighteen shillings and four pence, and the yearly value of the said benefice of Swallow in the same books is seven pounds ten shillings and ten pence.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Richard Burdon, Viscount Haldane (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme) and with the consent of the said Earl of Yarborough (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of

and presentation to the said benefice of Limber Magna and the church thereof shall be assigned and transferred from Your Majesty, Your heirs and successors, and shall become and be absolutely vested in, and shall and may from time to time and at all times be exercised by the said Earl of Yarborough, his heirs and assigns for ever, and that in exchange for the same the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Swallow and the church thereof shall in like manner and upon and from the same date be assigned and transferred from the said Earl of Yarborough, and shall become and be absolutely vested in Your Majesty, Your Heirs and Successors for ever, and shall and may from time to time and at all times be exercised on behalf of Your Majesty by the said Richard Burdon, Viscount Haldane, or other the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain for the time being.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament.
