

MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.
Regulations under Section 9 (1).
COUNTY OF HERTFORD.

KNEBWORTH.

To the County Council of Hertford:—
And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of Section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), it is enacted that, within any limits or place referred to in Regulations made by Us, the Local Government Board, with a view to the safety of the public, on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour;

And whereas the County Council of Hertford, having made application to Us to make a Regulation in pursuance of the said sub-section putting the above-mentioned provisions of that sub-section in force within the limits comprising parts of certain roads situate in Knebworth, in the county of Hertford, We directed a Local Inquiry to be held into the matter by one of Our Inspectors, and the Inquiry was held accordingly, and Report has been made to Us thereon:

NOW THEREFORE, in pursuance of the powers given to Us in that behalf, We do, by this Our Order, make the following Regulations:—

ARTICLE I.—The provisions of sub-section (1) of Section 9 of the Act with respect to the driving of a motor car at a speed not exceeding ten miles per hour shall apply and have effect within the limits comprising so much of the Great North Road as extends from a point 100 yards north of its junction with the road leading to Knebworth Station to a point 50 yards south of its junction with Swangley Lane.

ARTICLE II.—These Regulations shall come into operation on the seventh day of July, one thousand nine hundred and thirteen.
