REGULATIONS respecting Open Competitive Examinations for the Situation of Woman Clerk in certain Public Departments, viz. :—

The General Post Office, London.

The National Health Insurance Commission, England.

The National Health Insurance Commission, Scotland.

*** These Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.*

1. The limits of age for these situations are 18 and 20. If an Examination begins in one of the first six months of any year, Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of March in that year. If an Examination begins in one of the last six months of any year, Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of September in that year.

In reckoning age for Competition, persons who have served for two full consecutive years in any Civil situation to which they were admitted with the Certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners may deduct from their actual age any time not exceeding five years which they may have spent in such service.

Persons transferred to situations in the Post Office from a Telephone Company or Municipal Telephone Undertaking, on the absorption of such Company or Undertaking by the Post Office, may reckon, as if it were service in a situation to which they were admitted with the Certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners, their continuous service in the Post Office, as well as so much of their previous continuous service in the Telephone Company or Undertaking (or in any Telephone Company or Municipal Telephone Undertaking previously absorbed by it) as was rendered in situations for which a Civil Service Certificate is ordinarily required.

(c) That they are natural-born or naturalised British subjects.

3. At each Examination the number of Candidates to be selected will be such as may from time to time be fixed.

4. The Examination will be in the following subjects, viz. :—

1. English Composition (including Writing and Spelling).

2. Arithmetic.

3. Geography.

4. Latin, or French, or German.

5. Précis Writing.

6. English History.

7. Mathematics.

8. One of the languages, Latin, French, German, which is not offered as subject 4.

Not more than one of the subjects numbered 6 to 8 may be offered.

Candidates who fail to obtain such an aggregate number of marks as may indicate in the judgment of the Civil Service Commissioners a competent amount of general proficiency will not be regarded as qualified.

5. No Candidate will be admitted to examination who does not, at such time as may be fixed by the Civil Service Commissioners, produce an undertaking, signed by her Parent or Guardian, that she will, if successful, reside either with her parents or guardians, or with relations or friends approved by such parents or guardians.

6. Candidates for the Post Office Service must be at least five feet in height.

7. Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to attend the examination, dated before the commencement of the competition.

8. Persons who have entered upon or completed a course of education or training for the occupation of teacher, on account of which grants are payable from the Exchequer, will not be qualified to receive appointments until the consent of the Board of Education in England, the Committee of Council on Education for Scotland, or the Commissioners of National Education, Ireland, as the case may be, given in conformity with rules sanctioned by the Lords of the Treasury, has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

9. Application for permission to attend an Examination must be made at such times and in such manner as may be fixed by the Civil Service Commissioners.

2. In the commutation of a pension or any

portion thereof there shall be charged a fee of one per cent. on the amount awarded, provided that such fee shall never be less than £1 nor more than £10 in each case.

3. On being informed of the amount of money to be paid in commutation of the pension the applicant shall have the option of withdrawing his application on the payment of a fee of £2 within thirty days after receiving the notice, but where the distance is so great as to make it impossible for a reply by post to be received within the thirty days, the time may be extended to such period as the Treasury may direct. If the applicant shall not withdraw his application and pay the above fee within the prescribed period, the decision shall be considered final and the commutation of the pension shall take place absolutely.

4. 6. In the event of an applicant not taking steps to complete the necessary forms or failing to attend for medical examination when called upon to do so within seven months of an application being received by the Pensions Commutation Board, the Department recommending the case shall be informed thereof and no further steps shall be taken without a renewed application from the person proposing to commute and a further recommendation from the Department in which the applicant served.

7. The Regulations made by the Treasury on the 27th July, 1871, prescribing the Table on the basis of which commutation was to be calculated and the fees payable on the withdrawal of applications for commutation, and No. 3 of the Regulations made on the 28th October, 1882, prescribing the fees payable on the commutation of any portion of a pension after the first are hereby revoked, without prejudice to anything done in pursuance of those Regulations.

BYE-LAWS AND REGULATIONS

Made By

THE NOTTINGHAMSHIRE AND DERBYSHIRE TRAMWAYS COMPANY,

under the powers conferred on the Company by Section 46 of the Tramways Act, 1870.

1. The term "the Company" shall mean the Nottinghamshire and Derbyshire Tramways Company.

The expression "conductor" shall include any officer or servant in the employment of the Company, and having charge of a car.

2. The bye-laws and regulations hereinafter set forth shall extend and apply to all cars of the Company, and to all places with respect to which the Company have power to make bye-laws or regulations.

3. Every person shall enter or depart from a car by the step of the hindermost or conductor's platform, and not otherwise, unless so directed by the conductor. No person shall board or enter or attempt to board or enter a car until all passengers desiring to alight have done so.

4. No person shall enter, mount or leave or attempt to enter, mount or leave any car whilst in motion.

5. No person shall spit in or upon any car, or in any of the stations or premises occupied by the Company.

6. No passenger or other person shall, while in or upon any car; play or perform upon any musical instrument.

7. No person in a state of intoxication, or affected with any dangerous, contagious, or infectious disorder, shall enter or mount upon any car, and any such person found in or upon any car shall be immediately removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

8. No person shall smoke or carry a lighted pipe, cigar or cigarette in or on any car, except on the upper deck of the car.

9. No person shall whistle, or sing, or swear, or use obscene, noisy or offensive language, whilst in or upon any car, or commit any nuisance in or upon or against any car, or wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger.

10. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil or damage the cushions, or the linings, or remove, or deface any number plate, printed, or other notice, in or upon any car, or break or scratch any window of or otherwise wilfully damage any car. Any person acting in contravention of this bye-law shall be liable to the penalty prescribed by these bye-laws in addition to the liability to pay the amount of any damage done.

11. A person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of the conductor of a car, soil or injure the linings or cushions of a car, or the dress or clothing of any passenger or a person who, in the opinion of the conductor, might for any reason be offensive to passengers, shall not be entitled to enter or remain in or upon any car, and may be prevented from entering any car, and shall not enter or mount upon any car after having been requested not to do so by the conductor, and if found in or upon any car shall, on request of the con-

ductor, leave the car upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned; provided that on cars specially run for artisans, mechanics, and daily labourers no person shall be prevented from entering or remaining in or on a car under the provisions of this bye-law, on the ground of the condition of his dress or clothing, if such condition is solely due to the nature of his employment.

12. Each passenger shall on demand pay to the conductor or other duly authorized officer of the Company the fare legally demandable for the journey.

13. Each passenger shall show his ticket (if any) when required so to do to the conductor or any duly authorized servant of the Company, and shall also, when required so to do, either deliver up his ticket or pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger.

14. A ticket shall only be available for the car on or for which it is issued (except in the case of transfer or return), and no passenger shall be entitled to leave any car for any purpose whatsoever at any stage or place and resume his journey by a different car from that on or for which such ticket was issued without payment of a fresh fare from the point at which the passenger again entered the same or other car. Tickets issued to passengers are not transferable.

15. No person shall wilfully alter or deface his ticket so as to render the number or any material portion thereof illegible.

16. No passenger shall use or attempt to use a ticket on any day for which such ticket is not available, or which has already been used on a previous journey.

17. A passenger not being an artisan, mechanic, or daily labourer within the true intent and meaning of the statutory provisions relating to the Company shall not use or attempt to use any ticket intended only for such artisans, mechanics, or daily labourers.

18. Personal or other luggage (including the tools of artisans, mechanics, and daily labourers) shall, unless otherwise permitted by the conductor, be placed on the driver's platform, and not elsewhere.

19. No passenger or other person not being a servant of the Company shall ride on the steps or platforms of any car, or stand on the upper deck, or sit, lean or stand on the outside rail on the upper deck of any car. Any passenger or other person so acting shall cease to do so immediately on request by the conductor.

20. When any car contains in the lower deck thereof the full number of passengers for which seating accommodation is provided in such lower deck, no additional person shall enter by coming into the lower deck of such car, except by the express permission of the conductor first obtained. When any car contains on the upper deck thereof the full number of passengers for which seating accommodation is provided on such upper deck, no person beyond such number shall enter, mount, or remain thereon.

21. No dog or other animal shall be allowed on the lower deck nor on the upper deck of any car in any case in which the conveyance of such dog or other animal might be offensive or an

annoyance to any passenger. No person shall take a dog or other animal on to any car after having been requested by the conductor not to do so. Any dog or other animal taken on to any car shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from the car immediately upon request by the conductor, and in default of compliance with such request may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

22. No person shall travel in or on any car with loaded firearms or with any article, instrument or implement, or any material or substance which may be dangerous or offensive to any passenger.

23. No person, other than a servant of the Company, acting in the performance of his duty, shall change or remove the route indicators or destination boards, or interfere with the controller, brakes, lamps, lights, trolley ropes, or any part of a car or its equipment, and no person other than the conductor or other servant of the Company acting in the performance of his duty, shall ring or otherwise signal the car to start.

24. No person shall wilfully obstruct or impede any officer or servant of the Company in the execution of his duty upon or in connection with any car or tramways of the Company.

25. The conductor shall enforce these bye-laws and regulations, and prevent the breach thereof to the best of his ability.

26. If at any time a car becomes disabled, or in any way damaged or from any cause unable to proceed, the passengers shall, upon the request of the conductor, leave the same, and if such passengers have paid their fares, they shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of their fares so paid, but on production of their tickets shall be allowed to travel by the next available car the remainder of the distance in respect of which they have paid their fares. No person shall, except with the leave of the conductor, enter a disabled or damaged car.

27. Any person who shall commit, whilst in or on any car any breach of these bye-laws and regulations shall, if the offence is continued, be liable in addition to incurring the penalty hereinafter provided to be immediately removed from the car by or under the direction of the conductor, and if such person shall have paid his fare he shall not be entitled to claim its return.

28. Any person offending against or committing a breach of any of these bye-laws or regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings.

29. There shall be placed and kept placed in a conspicuous position inside of each car in use a printed copy of these bye-laws and regulations.

30. These bye-laws shall come into force on the first day of December, nineteen hundred and thirteen.
