The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Telegram, dated the 18th September, from His Majesty's Chargé d'Affaires at St. Petersburg in the following terms:—

Batoum reports Constantinople, Russian, Servian, Austrian and Roumanian Danubian ports declared infected with cholera.

Russian Government report, between August 26 and September 6, fifteen cases of cholera and five deaths in town of Kherson, and one non-fatal case in town of Nicolaiev. Town of Kherson considered infected by Russian Government.

Governments of Kherson and Bessarabia, districts of Balta in Podolia and Dnieper in Tauride, and prefectures of Odessa, Nicolaiev and Rostov-on-Don considered threatened with cholera.
