The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that an Open Competitive Examination for the situation of Assistant in the Royal Observatory, Edinburgh, will be held in London and Edinburgh, commencing on the 9th December, 1913, under the Regulations dated the 1st April, 1910, and published in the London Gazette of the same date.

The number of situations to be filled will be the number vacant at the time of the Examination.

No person will be admitted to the Examination, from whom the Secretary, Civil Service Commission, has not received, on or before the 20th November, an application, in the Candidate's own handwriting, on a prescribed form, which may be obtained from the Secretary at once.

**ORDER OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL
IN ENGLAND.**

(Dated September 18th, 1913.)

Whereas by the 21st Section of the Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1874, it is enacted that the Registrar-General, with the sanction of the Local Government Board, may from time to time alter Registration Sub-districts:—

1. And whereas it is expedient that the following changes should be effected in the constitution of the undermentioned Sub-districts of Ludlow Registration District, viz.:—

(1) That Diddlebury Sub-district should be united with Munslow Sub-district, the enlarged Sub-district to be called and known as Diddlebury Sub-district;

(2) that Hopton Cangeford Civil Parish should be transferred from Cainham Sub-district to Diddlebury Sub-district, as enlarged by this Order; and

(3) that Cainham Sub-district, as thus reduced, should be united with Ludlow Sub-

district, the enlarged Sub-district to be called and known as Ludlow Sub-district;

2. Now, therefore, I, Bernard Mallet, C.B., Registrar-General of Births, Deaths, and Marriages in England, in exercise of the powers given me by the above-mentioned Act, and with the sanction of the Local Government Board, do hereby order and declare that the foregoing alteration shall take effect accordingly.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of October, nineteen hundred and thirteen.
