The Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of Westmorland) Order, 1913.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1908, and upon application by the Council of the Administrative County of Westmorland, I hereby make the following Order:—

Title.

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of Westmorland) Order, 1913."

BIRDS.

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

II. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the Administrative County

of Westmorland to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the Schedule to the Act:—

Reed Bunting, Buzzard, Chiff Chaff, Corn Crake (Land Rail), Tree Creeper, Crossbill, Dipper or Water Ouzel, Peregrine Falcon, Pied Flycatcher, Spotted Flycatcher, Hawfinch, Heron, Kestrel, House Martin, Sand Martin, Merlin, Quail, Raven, Lesser Redpole, Redstart, Robin, Swallow, Swift, Coal Tit, Long-tailed Tit, Marsh Tit, Wagtail (all species), Blackcap Warbler, Garden Warbler, Grasshopper Warbler, Sedge Warbler, Willow Warbler, Wood Warbler, Wheatear, Whinchat, Lesser Whitethroat, Common Wren, Golden-crested Wren, Wryneck (Cuckoo's Mate or Snake Bird).

Certain Birds protected during the whole of the year.

III. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, does not extend, the killing or taking of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of Westmorland:—

Bittern, Reed Bunting, Buzzard, Chiff Chaff, Corn Crake (Land Rail), Tree Creeper, Crossbill, Dipper or Water Ouzel, Dotterel, Sheld Duck, Tufted Duck, Peregrine Falcon, Pied Flycatcher, Spotted Flycatcher, Goldfinch, Great Crested Grebe, Lesser Black-backed Gull, Hawfinch, Heron, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Lapwing (Peewit or Green Plover), Sky Lark, House Martin, Sand Martin, Merlin, Nightjar (Fern Owl, Goatsucker, Night Hawk), Owl (all species), Quail, Raven, Lesser Redpole, Redshank, Redstart, Robin, Stonechat, Swallow, Swift, Coal Tit, Long-tailed Tit, Marsh Tit, Wagtail (all species), Blackcap Warbler, Garden Warbler, Grasshopper Warbler, Sedge Warbler, Willow Warbler, Wood Warbler, Wheatear, Whinchat, Lesser Whitethroat, Great Spotted Woodpecker, Common Wren, Golden-crested Wren, Wryneck (Cuckoo's Mate or Snake Bird).

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the consent of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz. :—

SPECIAL REGULATIONS respecting Open Competitive Examinations for the Situation of Second-Class Clerk in the Dublin Metropolitan Police Courts.

N.B.—These Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.

I. The limits of age for this situation are 17 and 25, and Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of the Examination.

In reckoning age for competition the following allowances will be made, viz. :—

(i.) Persons who have served in the Army or Navy may deduct from their actual age any time during which they have served ;

(ii.) Persons who may be serving or who may have served in the Militia, the Imperial Yeomanry, the Honourable Artillery Company, or the Volunteers, may deduct from their actual age any time spent on actual military service, such time being reckoned by the number of days for which they received Army pay ;

(iii.) Persons who have served for two full consecutive years—

(A) In any Civil situation to which they were admitted with the Certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners,

(B) In the Royal Irish Constabulary, or

(C) As Registered Boy Clerks in connection with the Civil Service (if appointed on the results of the competition of September 22nd, 1908, or any previous competition) may deduct from their actual age any time not exceeding five years which they may have spent in such service.

NOTE.—Persons transferred to situations in the Post Office from a Telephone Company or Municipal Telephone Undertaking, on the absorption of such Company or Undertaking by the Post Office, may reckon, as if it were service in a situation to which they were admitted with the Certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners, their continuous service in the Post Office, as well as so much of their previous continuous service in the Telephone Company or Undertaking (or in any Telephone Company or Municipal Telephone Undertaking previously absorbed by it) as was rendered in situations for which a Civil Service Certificate is ordinarily required.

6. Proceedings before Magistrates.

8. Copying imperfect manuscripts.
9. Indexing or Docketing.
10. Digesting Returns, &c., into Summaries.
11. Book-keeping by Single Entry.
12. Any one of the following, viz. :—
 - a. Latin (translation from).
 - b. French (translation from).
 - c. German (translation from).
 - d. Geography and English History.

III. The Examinations are open to all natural-born or naturalised British subjects being of the requisite age, health, and character, with the following restrictions :—

(i.) The following persons are ineligible, viz. :—

Members of the Royal Irish Constabulary of less than five years' service.

(ii.) The following classes of persons are eligible under certain conditions only, that is to say :—

(a) Persons actually serving in the Army.

(b) Persons actually serving in the Navy.

(c) Persons holding situations in the Civil Service.

(d) Members of the Royal Irish Constabulary, of more than five years' service.

(e) Apprentices in His Majesty's Dockyards.

(f) Persons who have entered upon or completed a course of education or training for the occupation of teacher, on account of which grants are payable from the Exchequer.

No person actually serving in the Army will be eligible unless he produces to the Civil Service Commissioners, when called upon to do so, the permission of his Commanding Officer to attend the examination, dated before the commencement of the competition and given in accordance

with such orders as may from time to time be issued by or under the authority of the Army Council.

No person actually serving in the Navy will be eligible unless he produces to the Civil Service Commissioners, when called upon to do so, the permission of his Commanding Officer to attend the examination, dated before the commencement of the competition and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued by or under the authority of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty.

Persons comprised in the classes (c), (d), (e) must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to attend the examination, before the commencement of the competition.

Persons comprised in class (f) will not be qualified to receive appointments until the consent of the Board of Education in England, the Committee of Council on Education for Scotland, or the Commissioners of National Education, Ireland, as the case may be, given in conformity with rules sanctioned by the Lords of the Treasury, has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

IV. Application for permission to attend an Examination must be made at such time and in such manner as the Civil Service Commissioners may appoint.

V. A fee of £2 will be required from each Candidate attending an Examination.

Special Provisions applicable to Landing Place.

2. Cattle, sheep, goats and swine brought from Ireland and landed at the Landing Place shall be moved between the points X and Z on a movable gangway, which after the landing of each cargo shall be cleansed and disinfected by the occupier of the Landing Place to the satisfaction of an Inspector of the Board.

Short Title and Commencement.

3. This Order may be cited as the STRANRAER IRISH ANIMALS LANDING PLACE ORDER OF 1913, and shall come into operation

on the twenty-third day of September, nineteen hundred and thirteen.
