Whitehall, September 10, 1913.

The KING has been pleased to grant unto Henry Frederic Vilmet Oldham, of Hyde Park Gate, in the Royal Borough of Kensington, Gentleman, His Royal licence and authority that he and his issue may, in compliance with a clause contained in the last will and testament of Elizabeth Vilmet, widow and relict of Frederick Vilmet, late of Verlands, in the parish of Niton, in the Isle of Wight, Gentleman, deceased, take and henceforth use the surname of Vilmet in addition to and after that of Oldham, and that he and they may bear the Arms of Vilmet; the said arms being first duly exemplified according to the Laws of Arms, and recorded in the College of Arms, otherwise the said Royal licence and permission to be void and of none effect:

And to command that the said Royal concession and declaration be recorded in His Majesty's said College of Arms.

WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of Westmorland) Order, 1913.

Dated 22nd September, 1913.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1908, and upon application by the Council of the Administrative County of Westmorland, I hereby make the following Order:—

Title

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of Westmorland) Order, 1913."

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

II. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the Administrative County
