

with such orders as may from time to time be issued by or under the authority of the Army Council.

No person actually serving in the Navy will be eligible unless he produces to the Civil Service Commissioners, when called upon to do so, the permission of his Commanding Officer to attend the examination, dated before the commencement of the competition and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued by or under the authority of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty.

Persons comprised in the classes (c), (d), (e) must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to attend the examination, before the commencement of the competition.

Persons comprised in class (f) will not be qualified to receive appointments until the consent of the Board of Education in England, the Committee of Council on Education for Scotland, or the Commissioners of National Education, Ireland, as the case may be, given in conformity with rules sanctioned by the Lords of the Treasury, has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

IV. Application for permission to attend an Examination must be made at such time and in such manner as the Civil Service Commissioners may appoint.

V. A fee of £2 will be required from each Candidate attending an Examination.

STRANRAER IRISH ANIMALS LANDING PLACE ORDER OF 1913.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1911, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Landing of Irish Animals at Stranraer.

1. The part of the port of Stranraer described in the Schedule hereto is hereby defined as a Landing Place for Irish Animals.

Special Provisions applicable to Landing Place.

2. Cattle, sheep, goats and swine brought from Ireland and landed at the Landing Place shall be moved between the points X and Z on a movable gangway, which after the landing of each cargo shall be cleansed and disinfected by the occupier of the Landing Place to the satisfaction of an Inspector of the Board.

Short Title and Commencement.

3. This Order may be cited as the STRANRAER IRISH ANIMALS LANDING PLACE ORDER OF 1913, and shall come into operation

on the twenty-third day of September, nineteen hundred and thirteen.
