**NATIONAL INSURANCE ACTS,
1911 to 1913.**

Notice is hereby given, under the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that it is proposed by the National Health Insurance Joint Committee, acting jointly with the Insurance Commissioners, after the expiration of at least 40 days from this date, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by the National Insurance Acts, 1911 to 1913, and by the National Insurance (Joint Committee) Regulations, 1912 and 1913, to make new regulations as to the administration of medical benefit, and by such regulations to revoke the following regulations so far as they apply to England, viz.:—

The National Health Insurance (Administration of Medical Benefit) Regulations, 1912 and 1913;

The National Health Insurance (Medical Practitioners: Inquiry Procedure) Regulations, 1913; and

Part IV of the National Health Insurance (Panel and Pharmaceutical Committees) Regulations, 1913.

MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.

COUNTY OF ESSEX.

Whereas by sub-section 1 of section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903, it is enacted that within any limits or place referred to in regulations made by the Local Government Board with a view to the safety of the public, on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour:

And whereas the County Council of Essex have made application to the Local Government Board for a regulation to be made in pursuance of the said sub-section putting the above-mentioned provisions of that sub-section in force within the limits comprising the following parts of roads in the Urban District of Leyton, that is to say:—

So much of the High Road, Leyton, as extends from its junction with Lea Bridge Road to the south-west corner of William Street;

So much of the Lea Bridge Road as extends from the north-west corner of Bromley Road to a point immediately clear of the junction of the Lea Bridge Road with Poplars Road; and

So much of Hoe Street as extends from its junction with Lea Bridge Road to the north-west corner of Poplars Road;

And whereas notice of the said application and of the time and manner in which objections should be made to any such regulation appeared in the London Gazette of the 6th day of May, 1913, and in the Leytonstone Express of the 10th day of May, 1913;

And whereas certain objections to the making of any regulation in pursuance of the said provisions have been received by the Local Government Board, and it is expedient that further inquiry should be made in the matter of the said application;

Notice is hereby given, that R. C. Maxwell, Esquire, Barrister-at-Law, one of the Inspectors of the Local Government Board, will attend at the Town Hall, Leyton, on Monday, the 24th day of November, 1913, at half-past two o'clock in the afternoon, to hold a Local Inquiry into the subject-matter of the said application;

And notice is hereby further given, that any person interested may attend at such Inquiry and be heard with reference to the said application.
