

is described in the Schedule hereunder written, and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto appended, and do direct that the same shall be called "The Particular District of Saint Alban, Westbury on Trym."

And the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, with the like consent of the said George Forrest, Bishop of Bristol (testified as aforesaid), in further exercise and execution of the powers or authorities contained in the said Acts of Parliament called "The Church Building Acts," or in some of them, and particularly in the said Act of the first and second years of His said late Majesty King William the Fourth, chapter thirty-eight, in the Act of the third and fourth years of Her said late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter sixty, in the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-six (such two lastly mentioned Acts being also two of "The Church Building Acts" before named), in the said Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-seven, and in the said Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five, and of all other powers or authorities in anywise enabling them in this behalf, do hereby determine and declare that banns of matrimony shall be published and that marriages, baptisms, churchings and burials shall be solemnized or performed at the church of the said particular district of Saint Alban, Westbury on Trym, and do hereby order and direct that all the fees, dues, offerings or other emoluments to be received in respect of such publication of banns of matrimony and of such solemnization or performance of marriages, baptisms, churchings and burials at the same church shall, from and after the next avoidance of the vicarage of the said parish of Westbury on Trym, belong to the Incumbent for the time being of the said particular district of Saint Alban, Westbury on Trym: Provided always that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism or for the registration thereof.

In witness whereof the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have hereunto affixed their common seal, and the said George Forrest, bishop of the said diocese of Bristol, has hereunto set his hand and affixed his episcopal seal this sixth day of November, in the year one thousand nine hundred and thirteen.

The SCHEDULE.

The particular district of Saint Alban, Westbury on Trym, being all that part of the parish of Westbury on Trym, in the county of Gloucester and in the diocese of Bristol, which is bounded upon the east by the new parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Bishopston, in the said county and diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south-east, upon the south, upon the west, and upon the north, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Michael and All Angels,

Bishopston, from the said parish of Westbury on Trym, at the point where the stream, which is followed by the same boundary, is joined by the stream which flows across Redland Green, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the last-mentioned stream for a distance of twenty-two chains and a half or thereabouts to the point where such stream meets the fence forming the western boundary of Redland Green, and extending thence south-westward in a straight line for a distance of eight chains and a quarter or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the present north-eastern end of Canowie Road, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Canowie Road for a distance of four chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with Redland Road, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of Redland Road for a distance of three chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road called Redland Hill, and extending thence first south-westward and then westward along the middle of Redland Hill (thereby following in part the boundary which divides the new parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Clifton, in the said county and diocese, from the said parish of Westbury on Trym) for a distance of nineteen chains or thereabouts to its junction with Westbury Road, and extending thence northward along the middle of Westbury Road for a distance of forty-four chains or thereabouts to a point due west of the junction of Etloe Road and the road called North View, and extending thence in a straight line due east for a distance of four chains or thereabouts to the junction of Etloe Road and North View, and extending thence first south-eastward and then north-eastward along the middle of North View for a distance of sixteen chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with Linden Road almost opposite to the western end of the wall or fence forming the northern boundary of the houses and premises situate on the northern side of Howard Road, and extending thence north-eastward to and along the said wall or fence for a distance of ten chains and a half or thereabouts to the point where such wall or fence meets the wall or fence forming the eastern boundary of the house and premises known as Number 53, Howard Road, and extending thence south-eastward along the last-mentioned wall or fence for a distance of one chain and a quarter or thereabouts to its southern end on the northern side of Howard Road, and extending thence south-eastward first to the junction of Howard Road and Halsbury Road, and then along the middle of Halsbury Road for a distance of fifteen chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with Crewe Road, and extending thence north-eastward in continuation of a line along the middle of Crewe Road for a distance of two chains and a half or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said parish of Westbury on Trym from the said new parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Bishopston.
