THE PUBLIC HEALTH ACTS AMENDMENT ACT, 1907.

THE URBAN DISTRICT OF LONGBENTON,
In the County of Northumberland.

CRICKHOWEL RURAL DISTRICT.

NOTICE is hereby given, that the Local Government Board have issued an Order, dated the 6th October, 1913, declaring section 25 of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1907, to be in force in the several contributory places within the rural district of Crickhowel on and after the 17th November, 1913, subject to the following condition and adaptation; that is to say:—

Unless and until the Local Government Board, by a further Order, made on such application and after compliance with such requirements as are described and set forth in section 3 of the Act of 1907, otherwise declare, specify and direct, the said section, in its application to the contributory place and in relation to the exercise of the powers and to the discharge of the duties of the local authority under that section, shall have effect as if the words and figures following were added to and formed part of the section, that is to say:—

"The power of making or enforcing bye-laws under section one hundred and fifty-seven of the Public Health Act, 1875, as extended by section twenty-three of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1890, with respect to the paving of yards and open spaces in connection with dwelling-houses, other than yards and open spaces common to two or more dwelling-houses, shall cease to be exercisable."

SOUTH METROPOLITAN CEMETERY COMPANY.

(Establishment of Crematorium in the South Metropolitan Cemetery, in the Parish of Lambeth in the County of Surrey; Bye-Laws; Penalties for Contravention Thereof; Charges and Fees for Cremations; Repeal and Amendment of Certain Provisions of Act 6 and 7 William IV, cap. 129; Application of Moneys; Other Purposes.)

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the ensuing Session by the South Metropolitan Cemetery Company (hereinafter called "the Company") for leave to bring in a Bill for all or some of the following amongst other purposes (that is to say):—

1. To authorize the Company to set apart a site for, and build, provide, fit up, equip and maintain a crematorium for the cremation of human remains on the following lands (that is to say):—
