HEREAS by section forty-three of the Customs Consolidation Act, 1876, it is provided that the importation of arms, ammunition, gunpowder, or any other goods may be prohibited by Proclamation:

And whereas it is expedient that the importation into Ireland of arms and ammunition and the other goods hereinafter mentioned should

be prohibited:

Now, therefore, We, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, in pursuance of the said Act and of all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, do hereby proclaim, direct and order as follows:—

As from and after the date of this Proclamation, and subject as hereinafter provided, arms and ammunition, and the following goods, that is to say, the component parts of any arms, empty cartridge cases, and explosives and combustibles for warlike purposes, shall be prohibited to be imported into Ireland:

Provided always, and it is hereby declared, that nothing in this Proclamation shall apply to any arms or the component parts of any arms, or any ammunition, or any empty cartridge cases, which in the opinion of the Commissioners of Customs and Excise are adapted for use, or intended to be used, solely for sporting purposes, or to any explosives or combustibles which in the opinion of the said Commissioners are intended to be used solely for mining or any other unwarlike purposes.

for prohibiting the carriage coastwise of military arms and ammunition.

W HEREAS by section eight of the Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1879, it is (among other things) provided that arms, ammunition, and any articles which His Majesty shall judge capable of being converted

into or made useful in increasing the quantity of military stores may by Proclamation be prohibited to be carried coastwise:

And whereas it is expedient that the goods hereinafter mentioned should be prohibited to be carried coastwise:

Now, therefore, We, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, in pursuance of the said Act and of all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, do hereby proclaim, direct and order as follows:—

As from and after the date of this Proclamation, and subject as hereinafter provided, arms and ammunition, and the following goods, being articles which We judge capable of being converted into or made useful in increasing the quantity of military stores, that is to say, the component parts of any arms, empty cartridge cases, and explosives and combustibles for warlike purposes, shall be prohibited to be carried coastwise:

Provided always, and it is hereby declared, that nothing in this Proclamation shall apply to any arms or the component parts of any arms or any ammunition or any empty cartridge cases, which in the opinion of the Commissioners of Customs and Excise are adapted for use or intended to be used solely for sporting purposes, or to any explosives or combustibles which in the opinion of the said Commissioners are intended to be used solely for mining or any other unwarlike purposes.

Whereas We have deemed it expedient that the proceedings of the Royal Commission on the Ancient and Historical Monuments and Constructions of England shall cover the period up to the year 1714, instead of up to the year 1700, and that a new Commission should issue for this purpose:

Now know ye that We have revoked and determined, and do by these Presents revoke and determine, the Warrants whereby Commissioners were appointed on the twenty-seventh day of October, one thousand nine hundred and eight, and the tenth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and nine, and every matter and thing therein contained.

And We do by these Presents authorize and appoint you, the said Herbert Coulstoun, Baron Burghclere (Chairman); David Alexander Edward, Earl of Crawford; Robert George, Earl of Plymouth; Harold Arthur, Viscount Dillon; Sir Schomberg Kerr McDonnell; Sir Henry Hoyle Howorth; Sir John Francis Fortescue Horner; John George Neilson Clift; Francis John Haverfield; Emslie John Horniman, and Leonard Stokes, to be Our Commissioners to make an inventory of the Ancient and Historical Monuments and Constructions connected with or illustrative of the contemporary culture, civilization and conditions of life of the people in England, excluding Monmouthshire, from the earliest times to the year 1714, and to specify those which seem most worthy of preservation.

And for the better enabling you to carry out the purposes of this Our Commission, We do by these Presents authorize you to call in the aid and co-operation of owners of ancient monuments, inviting them to assist you in furthering the objects of the Commission; and to invite the possessors of such papers as you may deem it desirable to inspect to produce them before you:

And We do further give and grant unto you, or any three or more of you, full power to call before you such persons as you shall judge likely to afford you any information upon the subject of this Our Commission; and also to call for, have access to and examine all such books, documents, registers and records as may afford you the fullest information on the subject, and to inquire of and concerning the premises by all other lawful ways and means whatsoever:

And We do by these Presents authorize and empower you, or any three or more of you, to visit and personally inspect such places as you may deem it expedient so to inspect for the more effectual carrying out of the purposes aforesaid:

And We do by these Presents will and ordain that this Our Commission shall continue in full force and virtue, and that you, Our said Commissioners, or any three or more of you, may from time to time proceed in the execution thereof, and of every matter and thing therein contained, although the same be not continued from time to time by adjournment:

And We do further ordain that you, or any three or more of you, have liberty to report your proceedings under this Our Commission from time to time if you shall judge it expedient so to do:

And Our further will and pleasure is that you do, with as little delay as possible, report to Us, under your hands and seals, or under the hands and seals of any three or more of you, your opinion upon the matters herein submitted for your consideration.

And for the purpose of aiding you in your inquiries We hereby appoint Our trusty and well-beloved George Herbert Duckworth, Esquire, to be Secretary to this Our Commission.

His Majesty the King has been graciously pleased to award the Edward Medal of the First Class to Joseph Campbell, and the Edward Medal of the Second Class to Alexander Farquharson, under the following circumstances:—

On the 7th February, 1913, an explosion of firedamp occurred in an old road at the Swinhill Colliery, Larkhall. A fireman was known to have been at the place of the explosion and, on hearing of the accident, Campbell, a fire-man, and Farquharson, a miner, rushed to the spot in the hope of rescuing him. Both men attempted to penetrate the road, but were driven back by afterdamp. Campbell made a second and third attempt, but without success. Then, remembering that a line of compressed air pipes led into the roadway and there was a blank flange on the end of them some distance away, the two men crawled in to the blank flange and unscrewed the bolts holding it in position. The afterdamp had not been cleared away, and Campbell's hands and legs became numbed by its effects; but he courageously stuck to his work till the flange was removed... A length of hose piping was then given to the men by others near, and air was passed through the pipes to clear away the afterdamp. Campbell then ran forward with the free end of the hose to the place where the fireman was supposed to be. After this, he was completely overcome, and had to be carried out.

The unfortunate fireman succumbed to the accident, but Campbell and Farquharson displayed very great courage in their gallant attempt to rescue their fellow workman under very dangerous conditions.

In pursuance of an Act for better preserving the Navigation of the River Mersey (5 and 6 Victoria, cap. cx), we, Joseph Crosfield and Sons, Limited, Bank Quay, Warrington, Soap and Chemical Manufacturers, hereby give you notice that we propose to construct in Warrington, in the County Palatine of Lancaster, and in Walton Inferior, in the County Palatine of Chester, in accordance with plans and sections deposited at the office of the Mersey Conservancy in Westminster, a transporter bridge across the River Mersey, of the form, nature and extent shown on the plans and sections aforesaid.

The transporter bridge will be constructed and erected on a line which will be at or about a right angle to the line of the River Mersey, and the situation of the centre line of the bridge will be, on the easterly (or Warrington) side of the River Mersey, at a distance of 28 feet (measured in a southerly direction) from the south-westerly corner of the fence belonging to the St. Helens Cable and Rubber Company, Limited, and on the westerly (or Walton Inferior) side, near the centre of the Timber Wharf which was erected by and which belongs

to us, Joseph Crosfield and Sons, Limited.

The object of the transporter bridge is to provide communication between works and factories belonging to and occupied by us on the two sides of the River Mersey. The abutments of the bridge will be constructed of brick work and concrete, and the super-structure will be of steel. The abutment on the easterly (or Warrington) side will project into the tidal waters of the River Mersey to the extent of 24 feet (measured from the line of high water on the Lancashire side of the river), and the abutment on the westerly (or Walton Inferior) side will project into these tidal waters to the extent of 21 feet (measured from the line of high water on the Cheshire side of the river).

The abutments of the bridge will exclude about 700 cubic yards of tidal water on a tide of the height of 21 feet, as measured from the level of the top of the sill of the Old Dock Gates in Liverpool. No other part or parts of the bridge will exclude tidal waters.

The work required for the construction of the transporter bridge will be commenced on or after the expiry of one calendar month from the date of this notice.
