LLANELLY.

Whereas the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Llanelly (hereinafter called the Corporation), being the Urban District Council for the said Borough, have made application to the Local Government Board for the issue of a Provisional Order under sections 297 and 303 of the Public Health Act, 1875, to partially repeal, alter, or amend the Llanelly Local Board Act, 1888, so as to provide for the audit of all the accounts of the Corporation and their officers by the District Auditor appointed by the Local Government Board in like manner as the accounts of an Urban Authority and their officers are audited under

sections 247 and 250 of the Public Health Act, 1875, in lieu of the audit provided by the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, and section 246 of the Public Health Act, 1875;

And whereas it is proposed that a Provisional Order should be issued in compliance with the said Application, and that it should make any such alteration or amendment of the said Local Act, or of any other Local Act or of any Act confirming a Provisional Order made in pursuance of any of the Sanitary Acts or of the Public Health Act, 1875, in force in the said Borough as may be necessary or desirable in connection with the objects of the said Application:
