Notice is hereby given, pursuant to the provisions of section 113 of the National Insurance Act, 1911, and of the Ninth Schedule to the said Act, that the National Health Insurance Joint Committee, acting jointly with the Insurance Commissioners, the Irish Insurance Commissioners, and the Welsh Insurance Com-

missioners, propose to make a Special Order under sub-section (7) of section 47 of the said Act—
