8978	1913. 18 December	... Declaration of the following foot-and-mouth infected places, namely:— 1. That portion of Rose Park Farm, in the occupation of James Francis Tooley, in the parish of St. Paul's Walden, in the administrative county of Hertford, which lies to the west and south-west of the road from Codicote to Whitwell, and the adjoining field to the north of the Brickworks which forms part of Hoo End Farm. 2. The buildings and the Mimram Field at the Mill, Whitwell, in the same occupation. 3. The fields known as Netherwell, west of the road from Kimpton to Whitwell, north of Horsley's Wood, and the fields known as Groveshot and Pond, east of the same road and north of the lane leading to Leggat's End, all forming a part of the Hoo End Grange Farm, in the same occupation.

WINSFORD URBAN DISTRICT.
