#### NATIONAL INSURANCE.

#### NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE.

The National Health Insurance (Outstanding Reserve Values) Order, 1914, dated January 23, 1914, made by the National Health Insurance Joint Committee under section 78 of the National Insurance Act, 1911 (1 & 2 Geo. 5, c. 55).

Whereas by section 78 of the National Insurance Act, 1911 (in this Order called "the Act"), it is amongst other things provided that if any difficulty arises in bringing Part I of the Act into operation the Insurance Commissioners (in this Order called "the Commissioners"), with the consent of the Treasury, may by Order do anything which appears to them necessary or expedient for bringing Part I of the Act into operation, and any such Order may modify the provisions of the Act so far as

may appear necessary or expedient for carrying the Order into effect:

And whereas by virtue of section 83 of the Act and the National Insurance (Joint Committee) Regulations, 1912 and 1913, the National Health Insurance Joint Committee (in this Order referred to as "the Joint Committee") are to exercise and perform, either alone or jointly with the several bodies of Commissioners, as the case may require, such of the powers and duties of those bodies under section 78 of the Act as may be necessary to enable the Joint Committee to exercise and perform the several powers and duties of the Joint Committee under the Act and those Regulations:

And whereas by sub-section (1) of section 43 of the Act it is amongst other things provided that if an insured person ceases to be a member of a Society and becomes a deposit contributor, his transfer value shall be carried to his credit

in the Deposit Contributors Fund, provided that if a reserve value has been credited to the Society in respect of him, such part of that reserve value as is still outstanding (or if the amount so outstanding exceeds the transfer value such part of the reserve value as is equal to the transfer value) shall be cancelled:

And whereas by sub-section (2) of the said section it is amongst other things provided that if a deposit contributor subsequently becomes a member of a Society, there shall be transferred to the Society the amount standing to his credit in the Deposit Contributors Fund, provided that if that amount exceeds the value of the contributions paid by or in respect of him estimated on the assumption that he had been a member of a Society since his entry into insurance, the excess shall not be transferred to the Society, but shall be carried to the credit of the Deposit Contributors Fund:

And whereas in a large number of cases persons who are members of Societies have become deposit contributors, and persons who were deposit contributors have become members of Approved Societies, and it has not been possible to give effect to the said recited provisions of the Act by reason of the fact that Societies have not yet been able to complete their claims for reserve values, and the several bodies of Commissioners have, in consequence, been unable to ascertain what part of the sums retained by them under sub-section (3) of section 55 of the Act is, under sub-section (4) of the said section, required for interest on the reserve values, and what sums are in accordance with the last mentioned sub-section to be written off the amount of the reserve values, and a difficulty has thereby arisen within the meaning of the said section 78:

And whereas for the purpose of bringing into operation section 43 of the Act, it is immediately necessary to estimate sums which shall be deemed to have been written off the amount of the reserve values, under sub-section (4) of section 55 of the Act, and the sums in this Order hereinafter mentioned have been calculated in accordance with such information relating to the number and classes of insured persons as is at the present time available to the Joint Committee:

Now, therefore, the Joint Committee, in pursuance of the powers conferred on them by section 78 of the Act and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, with the consent of the Treasury, hereby order as follows:—

- 1.—(1) For the purpose of ascertaining under section 43 of the Act the outstanding reserve value of a member of an Approved Society who becomes a deposit contributor, and the value of the contributions of a deposit contributor who becomes a member of a Society and, generally, for the purpose of bringing section 43 of the Act into operation, there shall be deemed to have been written off the amount of the reserve values under sub-section (4) of section 55 of the Act, a sum ascertained by multiplying, in the case of a man, one half of one per cent., or, in the case of a woman, one per cent., of the appropriate reserve value by the number of quarters terminating after the date of the entry into insurance of the insured person and before the date—
- (a) of his transfer from a Society to deposit insurance, or

- (b) of his transfer from deposit insurance to
- a Society, or

  (c) of his ceasing to be a member of a Society, as the case may require.
- (2) For the purposes of this Order, "quarter" means the time comprised in any period of currency of a contribution card issued under the Act where that period of currency does not exceed thirteen weeks, and, in any other case, the time comprised in the first thirteen weeks of a period of currency, or the time comprised in the remaining weeks of that period, as the case may require.
- 2. This Order may be cited as the National Health Insurance (Outstanding Reserve Values) Order, 1914.

Regulations under Section 8.

COUNTY OF LONDON.

GREEN STREET, BETHNAL GREEN.

To the London County Council;—
And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by Section 8 of the Motor Car Act, 1903, it is provided that We, the Local Government Board, may in the circumstances there specified, by Regulations made under Section 6 of the Locomotives on Highways Act, 1896, restrict the driving of any motor cars or of any special kind of motor cars, on any specified highway, or part of a highway;

And whereas the London County Council, having applied to Us to make a Regulation in pursuance of the above-mentioned Sections restricting the driving of motor cars on part of Green Street, Bethnal Green, We directed a Local Inquiry to be held into the matter by one of Our Inspectors, and an Inquiry was held accordingly, and Report has been made to Us thereon:

NOW THEREFORE, in pursuance of the powers given to Us in that behalf, We do hereby make the following Regulations:—

ARTICLE I.—A person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding eight miles per hour on so much of the highway known as Green Street, Bethnal Green, as extends from its junction with Globe Road to the Regent's Canal Bridge.

ARTICLE II.—These Regulations shall come

into operation on the ninth day of February, one thousand nine hundred and fourteen.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1911, the Dogs Act, 1906, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

#### Power to make Regulations.

- -(1.) The Local Authority of any District specified in the Schedule to this Order may, in accordance with the provisions of this Order, make Regulations, with a view to the prevention of worrying of cattle (including sheep), for requiring that dogs or any class of dogs shall, during all or any of the hours between sunset and sunrise, be kept by the owners thereof under control in manner prescribed by the Regulations.
- (2.) The Regulations may apply to the whole or any part of the District, and may exempt any class of dogs either generally or under prescribed conditions.

### Confirmation of Regulations.

- 2.—(1.) Regulations made under this Order shall not take effect unless and until they have been submitted to and confirmed by the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries.
- (2.) Unless the Board otherwise direct, the following provisions shall apply-
  - (i.) Notice of intention to apply for con-firmation of any Regulations shall be given in one or more of the local newspapers circulating within the District in two successive issues two weeks at least before the making of the application.
  - (ii.) For two weeks at least before an application, a copy of the Regulations proposed to be confirmed shall be kept at the office of the Local Authority of the District, and be open during office hours thereat to the No 28798.

inspection of ratepayers of the District without fee or reward.

- (iii.) The Clerk of the Local Authority shall on the application of any such ratepayer furnish him with a copy of the proposed Regulations on payment of sixpence.
- (3.) A copy of any Regulations made by a Local Authority under this Order, signed and certified by the Clerk of that Local Authority to be a true copy and to have been duly confirmed, shall be evidence, until the contrary is proved, in all legal proceedings, of the due making, confirmation, and existence of the Regulations without further or other proof.

### Seizure of Dogs where Regulations are Contravened.

3. Any dog in respect of which an offence is being committed against a Regulation made under this Order may be seized and treated as a stray dog under the powers conferred by section three of the Dogs Act, 1906.

### Extension of Definition in Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

4. Dogs shall be snimals for the purposes of the following sections of the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894 (namely):—

Section forty-three (Police); Section forty-four (General administrative

and also for the purposes of all other sections of the said Act containing provisions relative to or consequent on the provisions of those sections and this Order, including such sec-tions as relate to offences and legal proceedings.

### Local Authority to enforce Order.

5. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

## Prohibition of Landing except for slaughter within Landing Place.

- 1.—(1.) Cattle, sheep, goats or swine shipped from Ireland shall not, unless and until it is otherwise ordered by the Board, be landed after the date hereof at any port or place in Great Britain except in accordance with the following provisions of this Order.
- (2.) Cattle, sheep, goats or swine shipped from any port in Ireland; except Dublin, which is mentioned in the First Schedule to the Animals (Landing from Ireland) Order of 1913, may after the date hereof be landed at any Landing Place defined by Order of the Board as a Landing Place for Irish animals, but only for the purpose of slaughter within the Landing Place.
- (3.) Animals so landed shall be subject to the provisions of the Animals (Landing from Ireland) Order of 1913, except that the animals shall not be moved from the Landing Place, and shall be slaughtered therein within ninetysix hours after their landing.

#### Local Authority to enforce Order.

2. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

### Offences.

3. If any animal shall be landed or moved in contravention of this Order, or is not slaughtered as hereby required, the owner thereof, and the owner and the lessee and the occupier of the place of landing, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the landing or movement, and the owner and person in charge of the animal which is not so slaughtered, and the owner and the charterer and the master of the vessel from which the same is landed, as the case may be, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts or defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.
