UNIVERSITY OF LONDON.

NOTICE is hereby given, in pursuance of the University of London Act, 1898, that the following Amendment of No. 30 of the Statutes for the Management of the University of London, University College, has been made by the Senate of the University of London, and that copies of the amended Statute can be obtained on application to "The Secretary to the Senate, University of London, South Kensington, S.W."

To substitute for No. 30 of the existing Statutes the following Statute:—

30. The wife or widow or children of a Provost or Professor or Reader of the college in office, or of a deceased Provost or Professor or Reader who died in office or within a year of resigning office, or of an Emeritus Professor whether living or deceased, shall be admitted without payment of fees to all classes of the College to which they are admissible.
