Tangier, July 17. About the end of the last Moneth Gayland having certain intelligence brought to him at Are Fill'a of a great defeat given by Taffalete to Ben-Buker; wherein himfelf was taken priloner and that little hopes were lest of getting another Army into the Field to oppose the Conquerour, and finding the ill News which was spread about the City, had driven the people into despair, so that getting together in great numbers, they complained of their wants, threatning with much fury to defert him, unfels he could speedily supply them ; he began to consule his own security; and with fair words appealing them for the present, the next day took his opportunity to draw to his service the Officers and Soldiers of 3 Turks Men of War, which that day had brought in two Prizes, with Whest for the relief of the Town; who privately landing 200 men; which were placed in the most considerable parts of the Town, to make good his retreat; he declared to the people his resolution of leaving them, offering to take with him all fuch perforts as would be willing to take their parts of his Fortune; at which his declaration, the people in a high mutiny offered to detain him; but he nothing dismaied, with his Sword ran in amongst them; killing one of them with his own hand, and commanding the Furth to fire amongst them; which offering differst them; which done; he sent his Gryer about the Streets, to let them know his resolution to embark, offering to all that should go with him, that he would take care for them and their tamilies; and for th fe that should stay behind, he would leave such quantities of all lotts of Provision, as should erable them to defend the Lity, till they could literaduristed to good terms for their furrenders upon this Proclamation about 500 of them with their families came to embark themselves upon the Men-of War and 3 Satis's which were then to the Harbour.
