

Regulation in pursuance of the above-mentioned Sections prohibiting the driving of motor bicycles on certain highways within the said Borough:

NOW THEREFORE, in pursuance of Our powers in that behalf, We do hereby make the following Regulations:—

ARTICLE I.—A person shall not drive a motor bicycle either separately or attached to any other vehicle upon the highways known as Senate House Passage and Garrett Hostel Lane, in the Borough of Cambridge.

ARTICLE II.—These Regulations shall come into operation on the sixteenth day of February, one thousand nine hundred and fourteen.

THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT, 1888. SWINDON.

Proposed Constitution of County Borough.

Whereas in pursuance of section 54 of the Local Government Act, 1888, a representation has been made to the Local Government Board by the Council of the Borough of Swindon that it is desirable that by a Provisional Order under the said Act the said Borough should be constituted into a county borough:

And whereas any such Provisional Order may be made for any of the purposes mentioned in section 59 of the said Act, and may also amend any Local and Personal Act:

And whereas by section 297 of the Public Health Act, 1875, any Act confirming any Provisional Order made in pursuance of any of the Sanitary Acts, or of that Act, may be repealed, altered or amended by Provisional Order made by the said Board, and confirmed by Parliament:

And whereas it is proposed that a Provisional Order should be made by the Local Government Board for carrying into effect the proposal contained in the said representation and that such Order should, so far as seems necessary or proper for the purpose thereof, provide for the matters specified in section 59 of the said Act, or some of them, and should, so far as appears to be necessary, amend the provisions of the Local Acts in force in the borough and of the Acts confirming Provisional Orders made under the Sanitary Acts or the Public Health Act, 1875, and relating to the borough, or of some of such Acts:

Notice is hereby given, that H. R. Hooper, Esquire, M.Inst.C.E., one of the Inspectors of the said Board, will attend at the Town Hall,

Swindon, on Thursday, the twenty-sixth day of February, 1914, at half-past ten o'clock in the forenoon, to hold a Local Inquiry into the subject-matter of the said proposals and all other matters relating thereto:

THE PUBLIC HEALTH ACT, 1875.

CHATHAM AND ROCHESTER.

Proposed Formation of United District.

Whereas by section 279 of the Public Health Act, 1875, power is given to the Local Government Board to issue a Provisional Order to form any urban or rural districts or any parts thereof into a united district for any of the purposes of the said Act:

And whereas application has been made to the Local Government Board to issue a Provisional Order forming the City of Rochester and the Borough of Chatham into a united district for the purposes of the construction and maintenance of an intercepting sewer, an out-fall sewer, and works for the treatment and disposal of the sewage of the said city and borough.

And whereas any such Provisional Order will provide for the constitution of a Joint Board to act as the Governing Body of the united district, and as to the powers, rights, duties, capacities, liabilities and obligations of the Joint Board, and will contain regulations as to such other matters and things as the case may require:

And whereas it is proposed that the Local Government Board should issue a Provisional Order to form the said City of Rochester and the said Borough of Chatham into a united district for the purposes aforesaid and to make such provisions as aforesaid so far as the same shall be necessary:

Notice is hereby given, that A. G. Drury, Esquire, M.Inst.C.E., one of the Inspectors of the said Board, will attend at the Town Hall, Chatham, on Thursday, the nineteenth day of February, 1914, at a quarter to eleven o'clock in the forenoon, to hold a Local Inquiry into the subject-matter of the said application and the other matters aforesaid:

And notice is hereby further given, that any person interested may attend at such Inquiry, and be heard with reference to the said application and the other matters aforesaid.
