ANIMALS (LANDING FROM IRELAND)  
AMENDMENT ORDER OF 1914.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1911, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

*Extension of Landing Facilities to Animals Shipped from Dublin.*

1. The Animals (Landing from Ireland) Order of 1914 shall be read as if the words "except Dublin" were not inserted in Article 1 (2) thereof.

*Short Title.*

2. This Order may be cited as the ANIMALS (LANDING FROM IRELAND) AMENDMENT ORDER OF 1914.

BY THE LIEUTENANT-GOVERNOR.  
A PROCLAMATION.

Isle of Man  
To Wit.

WHEREAS, by section 2 of the Cattle Diseases Prevention Act, 1865, it is, amongst other things, enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of two members of the Council, by an Order in writing, to prohibit the importation or introduction into this Isle, of Cattle, Horses, Sheep or other animals for such period or periods as may be deemed necessary for the purpose of preventing the introduction of any infectious or contagious disease among cattle, horses, sheep or other animals in this Isle:

And whereas the infectious disease commonly called "Foot and Mouth Disease" prevails amongst animals in certain places in Ireland.

Now, I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of two members of the Council, do hereby order that, from and after this date, and until further orders, no animals shall be imported into this Island from Ireland.

In this Order, the expression "animal" shall mean any bull, cow, ox, heifer, steer, calf, sheep, swine or goat.

This Order may be cited as "The Importation of Animals (Ireland) Order of 1914."

THE PUBLIC HEALTH ACTS AMENDMENT ACT, 1907.

BENFIELDSIDE URBAN DISTRICT.

NOTICE is hereby given, that by an Order dated the 14th day of January, 1914, the Local Government Board have confirmed an Order made on the 16th day of April, 1913, by the Urban District Council of Benfieldside, in pursuance of section 112 of the Public Health Act, 1875, as amended by section 51 of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1907, declaring each of the trades of a Blood-drier, a Leather-dresser, a Tanner, a Fat-melter or Fat-extractor, a Glue-maker, a Size-maker, a Gut-scrapers and a Fish-frier within the Urban District of Benfieldside to be an offensive trade.
