PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

**W**HEREAS by section 26 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, after reciting that "Whereas in some instances tithings, hamlets, chapelries, and other places or districts may be separated from the parishes or mother churches to which they belong, with great advantage, and places altogether extra-parochial may, in some instances, with advantage be annexed to parishes or districts to which they are contiguous, or be constituted separate parishes for ecclesiastical purposes," it is, amongst other things, enacted, "That when with respect to his own diocese it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, or when the Bishop of any diocese shall represent to the said Archbishop, that any such tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place or district within the diocese of such Archbishop, or the diocese of such Bishop, as the case may be, may be advantageously separated from any parish or mother church, and either be constituted a separate benefice by itself or be united to any other parish to which it may be more conveniently annexed, or to any other adjoining tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place, or district, parochial or extra-parochial, so as to form a

separate parish or benefice, or that any extra-parochial place may with advantage be annexed to any parish to which it is contiguous, or be constituted a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes; and the said Archbishop, or Bishop, shall draw up a scheme in writing (the scheme of such Bishop to be transmitted to the said Archbishop for his consideration) describing the mode in which it appears to him that the alteration may best be effected, and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes, rent charges, and other ecclesiastical dues, rates and payments, and in respect to patronage and rights to pews, may be made with justice to all parties interested; and if the patron or patrons of the benefice or benefices to be affected by such alteration shall consent in writing under his or their hands to such scheme, or to such modification thereof, as the said Archbishop may approve, and the said Archbishop shall, on full consideration and inquiry, be satisfied with any such scheme, or modification thereof, and shall certify the same and such consent as aforesaid, by his report to His Majesty in Council, it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council to make an Order for carrying such scheme, or modification thereof, as the case may be, into effect; and such Order being registered in the Registry of the Diocese, which the Registrar is hereby required to do, shall be forthwith binding on all persons

whatsoever, including the Incumbent or Incumbents of the benefice or benefices to be affected thereby, if he or they shall have consented thereto in writing under his or their hands, but if such Incumbent or Incumbents shall not have so consented thereto the Order shall not come into operation until the next avoidance of the benefice by the Incumbent objecting to the alteration or by the surviving Incumbent objecting, if more than one shall object thereto, and in such case the Order shall forthwith, after such avoidance, become binding on all persons whatsoever”;

And whereas the Right Reverend Charles Lord Bishop of Oxford hath, pursuant to the enactment aforesaid, made a Representation in writing to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, as follows:—

“ I, Charles, Bishop of Oxford, in pursuance of the twenty-sixth section of the Pluralities Act, 1838, do hereby represent to Your Grace as follows:—

“ That there is in the county of Berks and diocese of Oxford the benefice of Upton with Aston Upthorpe, which benefice consists of the former chapelries of Upton and Aston Upthorpe (the boundaries of which former chapelries are well known and defined). The benefice contains a population of 329 or thereabouts, the nett income of the said benefice is two hundred and five pounds or thereabouts, of which thirty-six pounds fifteen shillings or thereabouts is the gross value of the tithe arising in Aston Upthorpe. The church at Upton has accommodation for 100 persons, and that at Aston Upthorpe for 100 persons.

“ There is also in the same county and diocese the benefice of Aston Tirrold, the parish whereof contains a population of 320 or thereabouts, with a church about three hundred yards from the church of Aston Upthorpe, accommodating 300 people or thereabouts, and the nett annual value of the said benefice is one hundred and forty-three pounds seven shillings and sixpence or thereabouts.

“ The patronage of Upton with Aston Upthorpe belongs to myself by virtue of my Bishopric, and that of Aston Tirrold to the President and Scholars of St. Mary Magdalen College, in the University of Oxford.

“ The Reverend John Henry Moore is the present Incumbent of the benefice of Upton with Aston Upthorpe, and the Reverend Lumley Cecil Green-Wilkinson is the present Incumbent of the benefice of Aston Tirrold.

“ It appears to me that under the said Pluralities Act, 1838, that part of the present benefice of Upton with Aston Upthorpe, which was formerly the chapelry of Aston Upthorpe, may be advantageously separated from the parish of Upton with Aston Upthorpe and united to the parish of Aston Tirrold, to which it is contiguous.

“ Pursuant to the directions contained in the twenty-sixth section of the said Act of Parliament, I, the said Lord Bishop, have drawn up a Scheme in writing annexed to this Representation describing the mode in which it appears to me the proposed alterations may best be effected, and how the changes consequent thereon in respect of ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes, rent charges and other ecclesiastical dues, rates and payments, and in respect to patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested. And I do hereby submit the same to Your

Grace, together with the consent thereto, in writing of myself as the patron of the said benefice of Upton with Aston Upthorpe (the Incumbent of the said benefice not being a consenting party), and of the President and Scholars of St. Mary Magdalen College, in the University of Oxford, and Lumley Cecil Green-Wilkinson as the patrons and Incumbent respectively of the said benefice of Aston Tirrold to the intent that if Your Grace shall on full consideration and enquiry be satisfied with such Scheme you may certify the same and such Consents by your report to His Majesty in Council.”

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop is as follows:—

#### “ The SCHEME.

“ That that portion of the benefice of Upton with Aston Upthorpe which was formerly the chapelry of Aston Upthorpe shall be separated therefrom and united for ecclesiastical purposes to the contiguous parish and benefice of Aston Tirrold.

“ That the people residing within the limits of Aston Upthorpe shall, if entitled to any accommodation in the parish church of Upton cease to be so entitled (except nevertheless any person or persons (if any) possessing a legal right by faculty or otherwise to any pew or sitting in the church of Upton, and who may not be willing to relinquish and give up the same), and shall become parishioners of the parish of Aston Tirrold with Aston Upthorpe.

“ That two Churchwardens shall be annually chosen for each of the said churches of Aston Upthorpe and Aston Tirrold in the customary manner, and at the time when churchwardens are usually appointed, and every person so chosen shall be duly admitted, and shall as heretofore do all things pertaining to the office of churchwarden as to ecclesiastical matters.

“ That baptisms, marriages and all other offices of the church shall be performed and solemnized as heretofore in the said churches respectively, and all ecclesiastical fees, dues and payments in respect thereof shall be paid and belong to the Incumbent for the time being of the said benefice of Aston Tirrold with Aston Upthorpe.

“ That the Incumbent of Aston Tirrold shall have exclusive cure of souls within the limits of Aston Upthorpe, and that all fees, ecclesiastical offerings, dues and payments and emoluments whatsoever arising from and within Aston Upthorpe in respect thereof shall henceforth belong to the Incumbent of Aston Tirrold.

“ That all and singular the tithe rent charge or other payments in lieu of tithes arising or which shall from time to time arise or become payable for or in respect of the lands and hereditaments within the limits of Aston Upthorpe shall be payable to the Incumbent of Aston Tirrold.

“ That the liability (if any) of the Incumbent of Upton with Aston Upthorpe for the repair of the chancel of the church of Aston Upthorpe shall be transferred to the Incumbent of Aston Tirrold with Aston Upthorpe.

“ That no alteration shall be made in the patronage of the said benefices or either of them.”

And whereas the said Bishop of Oxford, as patron of the said benefice of Upton with Aston Upthorpe, the President and Scholars of Saint

Mary Magdalen College, in the University of Oxford, as patrons, and the Reverend Lumley Cecil Green-Wilkinson as Incumbent, of the said benefice of Aston Tirrold have signed the Consents following:—

“ We, Charles, Bishop of Oxford, by virtue of our Bishopric, being the patron or person entitled to present to the benefice of Upton with Aston Upthorpe, in case the same were now vacant, the President and Scholars of St. Mary Magdalen College, in the University of Oxford, being the patrons or persons entitled to present to the benefice of Aston Tirrold in case the same were now vacant, and Lumley Cecil Green-Wilkinson, Incumbent of the said benefice of Aston Tirrold, hereby respectively signify to Your Grace our several Consents to the Scheme above proposed and set forth, and to every matter and thing therein contained, in testimony whereof we, Charles, Bishop of Oxford, have hereunto set our hand, We, the President and Scholars of St. Mary Magdalen College, in the University of Oxford, have caused our common seal to be hereto affixed, and I, Lumley Cecil Green-Wilkinson, have hereto set my hand this tenth day of March, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and thirteen.

And whereas the said scheme hath been transmitted by the said Bishop to the said Archbishop for his consideration:

And whereas the said Archbishop, being satisfied with the said Scheme, hath certified the same and the consents of the said patrons to His Majesty in Council by his report dated the nineteenth day of March one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, which report is in the words and figures following:—

“ We, the undersigned, Randall Thomas, Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury, do hereby represent to your Majesty in Council,

“ That the Right Reverend Charles Lord Bishop of Oxford has represented unto us (amongst other things),

“ That there is in the county of Berks and his diocese of Oxford the benefice of Upton with Aston Upthorpe, which benefice consists of the former chapelries of Upton and Aston Upthorpe. The said benefice contains a population of 329 or thereabouts.

“ That there is also in the same county and diocese the benefice of Aston Tirrold, the parish whereof contains a population of 320 or thereabouts.

“ That it appears to the said Lord Bishop that under the Pluralities Act, 1838, that part of the present benefice of Upton with Aston Upthorpe, which was formerly the chapelry of Aston Upthorpe, may be advantageously separated from the parish of Upton with Aston Upthorpe, and united to the parish of Aston Tirrold, to which it is contiguous.

“ That pursuant to the directions contained in the 26th section of the said Act, the said Lord Bishop has drawn up a scheme in writing describing the mode in which it appears to him that the proposed alterations may best be

effected, and how the changes consequent upon such alterations in respect of ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithe, rent charges and other ecclesiastical dues, rates and payments, and in respect to patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested, which scheme, together with the consents thereto, in writing, of the said Lord Bishop, by virtue of his bishopric the patron or person entitled to present to the said benefice of Upton with Aston Upthorpe in case the same were now vacant, the President and Scholars of Saint Mary Magdalen College, in the University of Oxford, the patrons or persons entitled to present to the benefice of Aston Tirrold in case the same were now vacant, and Lumley Cecil Green-Wilkinson, Incumbent of the said benefice of Aston Tirrold, has been transmitted to us by the said Lord Bishop for our consideration.

“ The representation and scheme of the said Lord Bishop and the consents above referred to are hereunto annexed.

“ And we, the said Archbishop, being on full consideration and enquiry satisfied with the said scheme, do hereby, pursuant to the said Pluralities Act, 1838, certify the same and such consents as aforesaid to Your Majesty in Council to the intent that Your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do, make, and issue an Order for carrying the said scheme into effect in accordance with the representation and scheme above referred to. We further recommend that all and singular, the tithe, rent charge, or other payments in lieu of tithes arising or which shall from time to time arise or become payable for or in respect of the lands and hereditaments within the limits of Aston Upthorpe shall be payable to the Incumbent of Aston Tirrold.

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the said scheme be carried into effect upon the occasion of the next avoidance of the said benefice of Upton with Aston Upthorpe.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by section 21 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, after reciting that “ whereas from the increase of population, or from other circumstances, it may be expedient that two or more benefices which have been heretofore united, or which may be hereafter united, under the provisions of this Act should be disunited,” it is, amongst other things, enacted “ that when two or more benefices shall have been united, or may be hereafter united into one benefice, and with respect to his own diocese it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, or the Bishop of any diocese shall

represent to the said Archbishop of the Province, that one or more of the benefices within his diocese, of which such united benefice shall consist, may be separated therefrom with advantage to the interests of religion, the said Archbishop shall inquire into the circumstances of the case, and, if on such inquiry, it shall appear to him that such union may be usefully dissolved, so far as respects such benefice or benefices, he shall, six weeks at least before certifying such inquiry to His Majesty as hereinafter directed, cause, with respect to his own diocese, a statement in writing of the facts, and in all other cases a copy in writing of the aforesaid representation to be affixed on or near the principal outer door of the church or in some public and conspicuous place in each of the benefices forming part of the united benefice, with notice to any person, or persons interested that he, she, or they may, within such six weeks, show cause in writing under his, her, or their hands to the said Archbishop against any such disunion, and, if no sufficient cause be shown within such time, the Archbishop shall certify the inquiry and consent, when the patron's consent is necessary, to His Majesty in Council, and thereupon it shall be lawful for His Majesty to issue an Order for separating such last-mentioned benefice or benefices from such united benefice, and for declaring the rights of patronage of the several patrons, if there be more than one patron, and such order shall be registered in the registry of the diocese to which such united benefice shall belong, which Order the registrar of such diocese, immediately on the receipt thereof, is hereby required to register accordingly, and thereupon immediately, if such united benefice shall be then vacant, otherwise on the first avoidance thereof, such union shall be ipso facto dissolved, so far only as regards such benefice or benefices so proposed to be separated from such united benefice, but in all other respects shall remain in full force and effect, and thenceforward such last-mentioned benefice or benefices shall be and be deemed and taken to be a separate and distinct benefice or benefices to all intents and purposes whatever as if no such union had taken place, and the patron or patrons thereof shall and may according to the terms of such Order present or nominate thereto respectively, and so, from time to time, upon each and every avoidance of the same: Provided always that no benefices which have been united for more than sixty years before the passing of this Act shall be disunited without the consent in writing of the patron or patrons thereof."

And whereas by section 23 of the said Act it is further enacted that "whenever two or more benefices which have at any time been united into one benefice shall be disunited and become separate benefices under the provisions of this Act, whether the Order for disunion shall extend to the whole number of benefices of which such united benefice consisted or to one or more of such benefices only, it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council, on the recommendation of the Archbishop of the Province with the consent of the patron or patrons of such benefices respectively (such consent to be signified in writing under the hands of such patron or patrons) to assign and attach such portion of the glebe lands, tithes, moduses, rent-charges or other endowments or emoluments belonging to or arising or accruing within the limits of such united benefice to each of such

benefices respectively as to His Majesty in Council shall seem fit notwithstanding such proportion of glebe lands, tithes, rent-charges, moduses, or other endowments or emoluments, or any part thereof, may not arise or accrue within the limits of the benefice to which the same shall be so assigned and attached as aforesaid, or may not have belonged thereto, and also to divide and apportion between such benefices all such charges and outgoings as before the disunion thereof were imposed upon the whole united benefice."

And whereas the Right Reverend Bertram, Lord Bishop of Norwich, hath made a representation in writing to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, as follows:—

"Whereas your Grace having enquired of me, Bertram Lord Bishop of Norwich, what are the circumstances of the case on which I found my opinion that the disunion of the united benefice of Burnham Sutton with Overy and medieties of Norton and Ulph, in the county of Norfolk, and my diocese of Norwich by the separation of the said mediety of Burnham Norton from the said benefice of Burnham Sutton with Overy and medieties of Norton and Ulph may be made with advantage to the interests of religion I do hereby represent to Your Grace that the circumstances of the case are as follows, that is to say:

"That the benefice of Burnham Sutton with Overy is a rectory to which are annexed medieties of Burnham Norton and Burnham Ulph.

"That the population of Burnham Sutton with Overy is 895 and the population of the parish of Burnham Norton with Ulph is 352.

"That the endowment of Burnham Sutton with Overy and medieties of Norton and Ulph consisting of

is £563 12s. 11d. per annum.

"That the endowment of the mediety of Burnham Norton consisting of half share of tithe, rent charge and glebe rents amounts to £113 3s. 9d. per annum.

"That there is a house of residence belonging to the united benefice of Burnham Sutton with Overy and medieties of Norton and Ulph.

"That the church of Burnham Sutton has long been in ruins the parishioners of such parish being entitled by a faculty dated the 31st day of July, 1771, to sittings in the church of Burnham Ulph.

"That it is expedient that the mediety of Burnham Norton aforesaid should be disunited from the rectory of Burnham Sutton with Overy and medieties of Norton and Ulph with a view to an order being obtained from the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England for the consolidation of the said mediety of Burnham Norton with the other mediety now annexed to Burnham Westgate, in the same county and diocese, under section 72 of 3 and 4 Victoria, cap. 113. This system of medieties which has divided between two clergymen the use of one church and the responsibility for the cure of souls in one parish being grievously against the interests of religion.

"That the patron of the said rectory of Burnham Sutton with Overy and medieties of Norton and Ulph is the Right Honourable the

## COAL MINES ACT, 1911.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department gives notice that on the 10th February, 1914, he made an Order under section 61 of the Coal Mines Act, 1911, entitled "The Explosives in Coal Mines Order of the 10th February, 1914," the effect of which is to add the following explosives, viz., "Faversham Powder No. 2," "Kent Powder," "Monarkite," "Monobel No. 1," and "Swale Powder" to the permitted explosives named and defined in the First Schedule to the Explosives in Coal Mines Order of the 1st September, 1913; to substitute an amended definition of the Explosive "Bellite No. 4," for the definition in that Schedule; and to remove the explosive "Sheppey Powder" from the permitted list.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1911, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

*Prohibition of Landing.*

1. Notwithstanding the provisions of Article 1 (2) of the Animals (Landing from Ireland) Order of 1914, cattle, sheep, goats or swine shipped from Ireland after the date of this Order shall not, unless and until it is otherwise ordered by the Board, be landed at any port or place in Great Britain.

*Local Authority to enforce Order.*

2. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

*Offences.*

3. If any animal shall be landed in contravention of this Order, the owner thereof, and the owner and the lessee and the occupier of the place of landing, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the landing, and the owner and the charterer and the master of the vessel from which the same is landed shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts or defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

*Short Title.*

4. This Order may be cited as the ANIMALS (LANDING FROM IRELAND) AMENDMENT ORDER OF 1914 (No. 2).

PIGGERIES) (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER  
OF 1914.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1911, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

*Premises to which this Order Applies.*

1.—(1.) This Order shall apply to the premises described in the Schedule hereto, and also to any other premises in the county

borough of Salford to which this Order may be applied by a Notice to that effect signed by an Inspector of the Board or of the Local Authority of the said borough and served upon the occupier of the premises described in such Notice.

(2.) This Order shall cease to apply to any premises upon service on the occupier thereof of a Notice to that effect signed by an Inspector of the Board.

(3.) A copy of every Notice served under this Article shall forthwith be sent to the Board by the Inspector signing the same.

*Restrictions on Movement of Swine from or to Premises to which this Order applies.*

2. Swine shall not, except as expressly authorised by this Order, be moved from or to any premises to which this Order applies.

*Movement of Swine for Immediate Slaughter.*

3.—(1.) Swine (not being in a Swine-Fever Infected Place and their movement not being prohibited by Notice of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board given under any Order of the Board) may be moved from any premises to which this Order applies to a slaughter-house, or to any lair specially authorised under Article 5 of the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, or Article 2 of the Swine-Fever (Movement from Ireland) Order of 1904, and being used for the purposes of such Article, if accompanied by a licence in the Form D set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, as amended by Article 1 of the Swine-Fever Order of 1911, authorising such movement, granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the county borough of Salford, which licence shall be in force for not more than eight days, inclusive of the day of issue.

(2.) Before a licence is granted by an Inspector under this Article the owner of the swine, or his agent authorised in writing for this purpose, shall sign, and deliver or send by post to the Inspector a declaration in the Form E set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, which shall be retained by the Inspector.

(3.) The swine shall, before the movement is commenced, be marked by and at the expense of the owner by the painting with an indelible composition of red colour of a broad line down the back and another broad line across the loins of each of the swine, thus +, each line being not less than nine inches long.

(4.) A copy of a licence which authorises movement of swine to premises in a district other than the district for which the person granting the licence acts as Inspector shall forthwith be sent by the Inspector to the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination specified in the licence is situate.

(5.) Where swine are moved with a licence under this Order to a lair the licence shall be delivered up in exchange for the licence necessary under the relative Order for movement

of swine from such premises. Where swine are moved with a licence under this Order to a slaughter-house the licence shall forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station in the same District by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing the movement.

(6.) The swine moved under this Article shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay, and where they are moved to a slaughter-house they shall be there detained until they are slaughtered.

(7.) During the movement the swine shall not be permitted to come in contact with swine not marked in manner prescribed by this Article.

*Cleansing and Disinfection of Vehicles used for Conveyance of Swine.*

4.—(1.) Any float, cart or van which has been used for the conveyance of swine under the preceding Article shall immediately after each occasion of such use be cleansed and disinfected by and at the expense of the person using the same for such purpose as follows:—

- (i.) The floor of the float, cart or van and all other parts thereof with which the swine, or their droppings, have come in contact shall be scraped and swept, and the scrapings and sweepings, and all dung, sawdust, litter, and other matter shall be effectually removed therefrom; then
- (ii.) The same parts of the float, cart or van shall be thoroughly washed or scrubbed or scoured with water; then
- (iii.) The same parts of the float, cart or van shall be disinfected in one of the modes prescribed by the Diseases of Animals (Disinfection) Order of 1906.

(2.) The scrapings and sweepings, and the dung, sawdust, litter, and other matter removed under this Article shall forthwith be well mixed with quicklime, and be effectually removed from contact with swine.

*Movement of Swine to Premises to which this Order applies.*

5.—(1.) Swine may be moved to any premises to which this Order applies, if accompanied by a licence in the Form A set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 authorising such movement, granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the county borough of Salford, under this Order or under the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, as the case may be. The licence shall be in force for not more than eight days, inclusive of the day of issue.

(2.) Before a licence is granted by an Inspector under this Article the owner of the swine, or his agent authorised in writing for this purpose, shall sign, and deliver or send by post to the Inspector, a declaration in the Form B set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, countersigned as hereinafter provided.

(3.) The declaration shall not be effective until it is countersigned by a police officer of the district where the swine are, who, before countersigning the declaration, shall, so far as is practicable, satisfy himself as to the correctness of the statements contained therein.

(4.) The declaration shall be retained by the Inspector granting the licence thereon.

(5.) The swine moved under this Article shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay.

(6.) Swine while detained on premises to which this Order applies need not be kept separate from other swine.

*Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.*

6.—(1.) Any person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the licence, if any, necessary for the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

*Local Authority to enforce Order.*

7. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

*Offences.*

8.—(1.) If a pig is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the pig, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the pig is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2.) If a pig is not marked as required by this Order, the owner, consignee, or other person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(3.) If any person, with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order, by washing, or in any other manner, takes out, effaces, or obliterates, or attempts to take out, efface, or obliterate, any mark painted on any pig as required by this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(4.) If a person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

*Interpretation.*

9. In this Order:—

“The Act of 1894” means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894:

“The Board” means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries:

“Swine-Fever Infected Place” means a place for the time being declared to be a Swine-Fever Infected Place under any Order of the Board:

“Slaughter-house” includes bacon-factory. Other terms have the same meaning as in the Act of 1894.

*Commencement.*

10. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-third day of February, nineteen hundred and fourteen.

*Short Title.*

11. This Order may be cited as the Salford (Cheltenham Street Piggeries) (Swine-Fever) Order of 1914.

BYE-LAWS.

NOTICE is hereby given, that the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the County Borough of South Shields, acting by the Council as the promoters of the tramways in the said county borough, authorized by the South Shields Corporation Act, 1903, did, in pursuance of the Tramways Act, 1870, on the 5th day of February, 1914, make the following bye-laws:—

1. Throughout these bye-laws the following words shall have the meanings respectively assigned to them, that is to say:—

“Conductor” means any servant of the Corporation having the charge of or helping in the charge of a car.

2. No dog or other animal shall be allowed in or on any car, except by permission of the conductor, nor in any case in which the conveyance of such dog or other animal might be offensive or an annoyance to passengers, but in no case shall a dog be allowed inside the car on the lower deck or on the platform or steps thereof.

No person shall take a dog or other animal into or on any car after having been requested not to do so by the conductor.

Any dog or other animal taken into or on any car in breach of this regulation shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from the car immediately upon request by the conductor, and in default of compliance with such request, may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

3. Any person offending against or committing a breach of any of these bye-laws shall be liable to a fine not exceeding forty shillings.

4. These bye-laws shall come into force on the 13th day of April, one thousand nine hundred and fourteen.

5. From and after the 13th day of April, one thousand nine hundred and fourteen, No. 5 of the bye-laws made by the Corporation on the 3rd day of April, 1907, under section 46 of the Tramways Act, 1870, shall be repealed.

And notice is also given, that a true copy of such bye-laws has this day been laid before the Board of Trade, and unless such bye-laws or any of them shall be disallowed by the said Board within two calendar months from the date hereof the same will come into force on the 13th day of April, 1914.
