The KING was pleased, at Buckingham Palace, on Thursday, the 12th instant, to present to John Jones, a miner, of Blackwood, Monmouthshire, the Albert Medal of the Second Class for gallantry in saving life on land, as detailed below:-

As a passenger train, travelling about seven miles an hour, was entering Pontypool Road Railway Station, on the 13th May, 1913, a boy of fifteen fell from the platform on to the rails, when the train was only twenty yards away. Jones, who was waiting on the platform, at once jumped down, and, as there was not time to lift the boy on to the platform, lay down between the rails and the platform and held the boy on his breast until the train had passed. Neither was injured, but it is evident that the boy owes his life to the courage and presence of mind displayed by Jones.

The Wild Birds Protection (City and County Borough of Birmingham) Order, 1914.

Dated 19th February, 1914.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1908, and upon application by the Council of the City and County Borough of Birmingham, I hereby make the following Order:—

### Title.

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (City and County Borough of Birmingham) Order, 1914."

### BIRDS.

### Close Time Extended.

II. The time during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall be extended throughout the City and County Borough of Birmingham so as to be between the 1st day of March and the 31st day of August in any year.

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880. III. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply throughout the area comprised within the boundaries of the City and County Borough of Birmingham to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the Schedule to the Act:—

Hedge Accentor (Hedge Sparrow), Blackbird, Bullfinch, Bunting (all species), Chaffinch, Chiffchaff, Coot, Corn Crake (Land Rail), Tree Creeper, Dipper, Turtle Dove, Firecrest, Fly Catcher (all species), Goldcrest, Greenfinch, Hawfinch, Kestrel, Linnet, House Martin, Sand Martin, Moorhen, Nuthatch, Pipit (all species), Water Rail, Lesser Redpole, Mealy Redpole, Redstart, Robin, Shrike (all species), Stonechat, Swallow, Swift, Missel-Thrush, Song Thrush, Tit (all species), Wagtail (all species), Warbler (all species), Wheatear, Whinchat, Whitethroat, Lesser

Whitethroat, Wren, Wryneck (Cuckoo's Mate or Snake Bird).

Certain Birds protected during the whole of the year.

IV. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, as extended by Clause II. of this Order does not apply, the killing or taking of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the City and County Borough of Birmingham:—

All Birds protected on Sundays and Bank Holidays.

V. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, as extended by Clause II. of this Order does not apply, the killing or taking of Wild Birds on Sundays, Christmasday, and Bank-holidays is prohibited throughout the City and County Borough of Birmingham.

### Eggs.

Certain Eggs protected throughout the year.

VI. The taking or destroying of the Eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the City and County Borough of Birmingham:—

The Wild Birds Protection (County Borough of Tynemouth) Order, 1914.

Dated 21st February, 1914.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1908, and upon application by the Council of the County Borough of Tynemouth, I hereby make the following Order:-

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (County Borough of Tynemouth) Order, 1914.''

### BIRDS.

### Close Time extended.

II. The period during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall be extended throughout the County Borough of Tynemouth for all birds (except the Black-headed Gull) specially protected by the schedule to the Act of 1880, as amended by the Act of 1881, so as to be

(a) Between the last day of February and the first day of September in each year for the Dotterel, Guillemot (Marrot, Murre, Scout or Willock), Gull (except the Black-headed Gull and the Black-backed Gull), Oyster Catcher, Puffin (Coulterneb, Sea Parrot), Razorbill,

Tern (Sea Swallow); and
(b) Between the last day of February and
the 12th day of August in each year for the American Quail (Colin), Auk, Avocet, Bee-Eater, Bittern, Cornish Chough, Cuckoo, Curlew (Whaup), Dunlin (Ox-bird, Plovers-page, Purre, Sea Lark), Eider Duck, Fulmar, Gannet (Solan Goose), Godwit, Goldfinch, Grebe, Greenshank, Hoopoe, Kingfisher, Kittiwake or Tarrock, Lapwing (Peewit or Green Plover), Lark, Loon (Diver), Mallard, Merganser, Nightingale, Nightjar (Fern Owl, Goatsucker, Night Hawk), Oriole, Owl, Petrel, Phalarope, Plover, Pochard (Dunbird), Redshank, Reeve or Ruff, Roller, Sanderling, Sandpiper (Summer Snipe), Shearwater, Sheldrake, Shoveller, Skua or Bonxie, Smew, Snipe. Spoonbill. Stint. Stone Curlew (Thick-Snipe, Spoonbill, Stint, Stone Curlew (Thickknee), Stonehatch (Ringed Plover), Teal, Tystey, Whimbrel, Widgeon, Wild Duck, Woodcock, Woodpecker.

### Certain Birds protected during the whole of the Year.

III. During the particular period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, as extended by Clause II of this Order, does not apply, the killing or taking of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the County Borough of Tynemouth:

Hedge Accentor (Hedge Sparrow, Dunnock), Blackbird, Bullfinch, Diver, Dotterel, Dunlin, Eider Duck, Goldfinch, Sparrow Hawk, Jackdaw, Kingfisher, Lapwing (Peewit or Green Plover), Larks, Brown Linnet, Green Linnet, Sand Martin, Nightjar (Fern Owl, Goat Sucker, Night Hawk), Owl (all species), Oyster Catcher, Redwing, Robin (or Red-breast), Starling, Thrushes, Blue Tit, Wrens.

### The Gull protected on Sunday, Christmas Day and Good Friday.

IV. During the particular period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, as extended by Clause II of this Order, does not apply, the killing or taking of the Gull (all species) on Sundays and on Christmas Day and Good Friday is prohibited throughout the County Borough of Tynemouth.

Whereas by Section 78 read with Section 82 of the National Insurance Act, 1911, in this Order called "the Act," it is amongst other things provided that if any difficulty arises with respect to bringing into operation in Wales Part I of the Act, the Welsh Insurance Commissioners may, with the consent of the Treasury, by Order, do anything which appears to them necessary or expedient for bringing that part of the Act into operation in Wales, and any such Order may modify the provisions of the Act so far as may appear necessary or expedient for carrying the Order into effect:


And whereas it is provided by the Act that the funds for defraying the expenses of administration of benefits shall be derived in certain proportions in the Act more particularly set forth from contributions from employed contributors and their employers and from monies provided by Parliament:

And whereas by sub-section (2) of Section 35 of the Act which relates to the accounts to be kept by Approved Societies and branches it is provided that Regulations made under that Section shall provide for a separate account being kept showing the amount expended on administration and for limiting the amount which may be carried to that account out of the contributions under Part I of the Act:

And whereas it is necessary, in order to bring Part I of the Act into operation in Wales, that Approved Societies and branches should be established, and for that purpose that expenses should be incurred in getting up and obtaining approval for those Societies and in forming branches thereof, and doubts have arisen as to whether it will be open to an Approved Society or branch when established to defray any expenses incurred by or on behalf of the Society or branch before approval has been obtained, or, in the case of a branch before the establishment thereof, and a difficulty has thereby arisen within the meaning of Section 78 aforesaid:

Now, therefore, the Welsh Insurance Commissioners, in pursuance of Section 78 read with Section 82 of the Act, and every other power enabling them in that behalf, with the consent of the Treasury, hereby order as follows:—

- 1. Any expenses reasonably incurred by an Approved Society for the purpose of becoming approved under the Act, or in repaying to any person expenses reasonably incurred by him in getting up or obtaining approval for the Society, and any expenses reasonably incurred by a branch of an Approved Society (being a branch which administers benefits under the Act) for the purpose of forming the branch or in repaying to any person the expenses of forming the branch may, if the Society or branch thinks fit, be treated as though they were expenses incurred by the Society or branch in the administration of the benefits conferred by the Act.
- 2.—(1) This Order may be cited as the National Health Insurance (Preliminary Expenses) Order (Wales), 1914.
- (2) The Interpretation Act, 1889, applies to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
- (3) The National Health Insurance (Wales) (Preliminary Expenses) Order, 1912, is hereby revoked.

1. Where before the 1st day of October, 1913, any contributions were paid by or in respect of a person employed under any local or other public authority in any employment other than the employments excluded by the National Health Insurance (Employment under Local and Public Authorities) Exclusion Order, 1913, who, by virtue of Section 6 of the amending Act, was on or after that date an employed contributor, that person shall be deemed to have been an employed contributor within the meaning of the principal Act during any period prior to that date in which contributions were so paid by or in respect of him, and all contributions so paid shall be deemed to have been properly paid:

Provided that nothing in this Order shall impose any liability upon any local or other public authority in respect of any contributions payable before the 1st day of October, 1913, to which that authority would not have been subject if this Order had not been made.

WE, THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT BOARD, in pursuance of the Public Health (Foreign Meat) Amending Regulations, 1909, HEREBY GIVE NOTICE that, for the purposes of those Regulations, the Official Certificates of which the details are set forth in the Representations or designs in the Schedule appended to and forming part of this Notice are, subject to the instructions given therein, hereby declared to be admissible, in the case of the four Russian slaughterhouses specified in the Schedule, from the date of the publication of this Notice, in the manner, to the extent, and subject to the rules and conditions prescribed in this Notice, as evidence that the pig from which any foreign meat has been derived has been certified by a competent authority in the place of origin to be free from disease at the time of slaughter, and that the meat has been certified by the like authority to have been dressed or prepared, and packed with the needful observance of all requirements for preventing danger to public health from using the meat as an article of food:

- AND FURTHER, with respect to the manner, to the extent, and to the rules and conditions in, to, and subject to which every official certificate is admissible as evidence for any such purpose as is hereinbefore described, We hereby prescribe as follows, that is to say:—
  - (i.) An Official Certificate, used in relation to foreign meat, or in relation to a box, case, receptacle or package containing foreign meat shall be admissible as aforesaid only where the meat is derived from a pig.
  - (ii.) An Official Certificate in the form of a label shall be admissible as aforesaid only where the label is securely affixed or attached to any foreign meat, or to any box, case, receptacle or package containing foreign meat; and where the label so affixed or attached has not, in any other circumstances, or on any other occasion been used as an official certificate.
  - (iii.) In this Notice, any word or expression to which a special meaning is assigned by the Public Health (Foreign Meat) Amending Regulations, 1909, has the same meaning as in those Regulations.





- -(1) No cattle, sheep, goats or swine shall be landed in or moved into or out of the District described in the Schedule to this Order, hereinafter referred to as the Scheduled District, or be moved along, over, or across, or be allowed by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray upon a highway or thorough-fare within the Scheduled District; provided that nothing in this Order shall be deemed to apply to the movement of animals into or out of the Scheduled District where they are moved through such District by railway from a place outside such District to another place outside such District without unnecessary delay, and without the animals being untrucked within such District except for the purposes of feeding or watering the animals within the railway station premises where such untrucking takes
- (2) If any farm (except any detached part) is partly within and partly without the Scheduled District, the whole shall be deemed to be within the Scheduled District.

### Power to Restrict Movement of Persons in Certain Cases.

- 2.—(1) An Inspector of the Local Authority acting under their direction may serve a Notice on the occupier of any field, shed, or other place in the Scheduled District, prohibiting the entry of any person into any such field, shed, or other place, and thereupon, notwithstanding the existence of any footpath or right-of-way, no person shall enter the field, shed, or other place to which the Notice relates while any cattle, sheep, goats or swine are therein, otherwise than in accordance with the following regulations, that is to say:—
  - (i.) The owner of the field, shed, or other place, or of the animals therein, or the agent or servants of such owner, may enter such field, shed, or other place so far as may be necessary for the feeding or tending of the animals.
  - (ii.) Any other person may enter such field, shed, or other place with a licence of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries.
- (2) Copies of such Notice shall be affixed or exhibited by the Inspector in such manner as he shall think desirable for ensuring notification of the restrictions hereby imposed.
- (3) A copy of every such Notice shall forthwith be sent by the Inspector to the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, 4, Whitehall Place, London, S.W.

### Local Authority to Enforce Order.

3. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority. No. 28806.

### Offences.

- 4.—(1) If an animal is landed in contravention of this Order, the owner, and the charterer and the master of the vessel from which it is landed, and the owner of the animal and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing or permitting the landing, and the person landing the same, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been landed in contravention as aforesaid, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.
- (2) If an animal is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the animal and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the animal, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the animal is moved shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.
- (3) If any person enters any field, shed, or other place in contravention of this Order, or of a Notice served thereunder, such person shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1911, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Movement of Animals into Certain Boroughs for Immediate Slaughter.

1. Notwithstanding anything in the Durham and Northumberland (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1914, an animal may, subject as hereinafter provided, be moved without a licence by railway or by vessel from outside the Scheduled District described in the Schedule

to that Order to a railway station or landing place situate within the Area comprising the boroughs specified in the First Schedule hereto or within any borough specified in the Second Schedule hereto; and an animal so moved may be moved from the railway station or landing place to any slaughterhouse or bacon factory situate within the Area or borough if accompanied by a Movement Licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the railway station or landing place is situate.

### Provisions as to Movement Licences.

- 2.—(1.) The movement of an animal with a Movement Licence under this Order shall be subject to the following conditions:—
  - (i.) The animal shall be moved to the slaughterhouse or bacon factory specified in the Licence, and not elsewhere, and shall be there detained, and shall be slaughtered within four days of its arrival thereat.
  - (ii.) The animal during the movement to the slaughterhouse or bacon factory shall, so far as is practicable, be kept separate from all animals not being moved with a Licence under this Order.
  - (iii.) After completion of the movement the Licence shall forthwith be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest police station in the same district by the person in charge of the animal at the time of completing such movement.
- (2.) A Movement Licence granted under this Order shall be in force for not more than four days, inclusive of the day of issue, and shall be in the form set forth in the Third Schedule hereto, or to the like effect.

Exception of Certain Animals from Provisions as to Movement.

3. Nothing in this Order shall be construed as authorising movement of an animal the movement of which is prohibited by Regulation of a Local Authority or by notice of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board given under any Order of the Board.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

- 4.—(1.) Any person in charge of an animal being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Licence, if any, necessary for the movement, and shall allow it to be read, and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.
- (2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.
