#### WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (County Borough of Stockport) Order, 1914.

Dated 25th February, 1914.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1908, and upon application by the Council of the County Borough of Stockport, I hereby make the following Order:—

#### Title.

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (County Borough of Stockport) Order, 1914."

#### BIRDS.

### Close Time extended.

II. The time during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds or any of them is prohibited by the Act of 1880, shall be extended, throughout the County Borough of Stockport, so as to be between the 1st day of March and the 13th day of August in any year.

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

III. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the County Borough of Stockport to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the Schedule to the Act:—

Common Bunting, Reed Bunting, Chiffchaff, Spotted Flycatcher, Heron, Kestrel, House Martin, Sand Martin, Meadow Pipit (Tit-
