RULE OF THE SUPREME COURT.

The following draft Rule is published pursuant to the Rules Publication Act, 1893:—

RULE OF THE SUPREME COURT (MARCH), 1914.

Order XXII., Rule 15, is hereby annulled, and the following Rule is substituted therefor.

In any cause or matter in the King's Bench Division in which money or damages is or are

claimed by or on behalf of an infant or a person of unsound mind not so found by inquisition, suing either alone or in conjunction with other parties, no settlement or compromise, or acceptance of money paid into Court, whether before or at or after the trial, shall as regards the claims of any such infant or person of unsound mind be valid without the sanction of the Court or a Judge, and no money or damages recovered or awarded in any such cause or matter in respect of the claims of any such infant or person of unsound mind, whether by verdict or by settlement, compromise, payment into Court or otherwise, before or at or after the trial, shall be paid to the next friend of the Plaintiff or to the Plaintiff's Solicitor unless the Court or a Judge shall so direct. money or damages so recovered or awarded shall, unless the Court or a Judge shall otherwise direct, be paid to the Public Trustee, and shall, subject to any general or special directions of the Court or a Judge, be held and applied by him, in such manner as he shall think fit for the maintenance and education or otherwise for the benefit of such infant or person of unsound mind.

The provisions of this rule shall also apply to all actions in which damages are claimed or awarded or recovered by or on behalf of an infant or person of unsound mind not so found by inquisition under the Fatal Accidents Act (9 & 10 Vict. c. 93). Nothing in this rule shall prejudice the lien of a Solicitor for costs.

The costs of the Plaintiff or if more than one of all the Plaintiffs in any such cause or matter or incident to the claims therein or consequent thereon shall be taxed by the Taxing Master, or if such cause or matter is proceeding in a District Registry by the District Registrar, as between party and party and as between Solicitor and Client and the Taxing Master or District Registrar shall certify the respective amounts of the Party and Party and Solicitor and Client's Costs, and the difference if any and the proportion of such difference (if any) payable respectively by any adult party to the cause or matter and by or out of the moneys of any party who is an Infant or such person of unsound mind and no costs other than those so certified shall be payable to the Solicitor for any Plaintiff in the cause or matter.

The result of any such taxation shall be notified to the Public Trustee by the Taxing

Master or District Registrar.

The Public Trustee in any case in which he is Trustee under this Rule may at any time and from time to time request the Court or a Judge to give him directions as to the trust or its administration or to vary directions which may have already been given in regard thereto or to determine any question arising therein and such directions or determination may be given accordingly.

An animal moved by vessel from outside the Scheduled District to a landing-place in the county borough of Newcastle-upon-Tyne for the purpose of subsequent exposure for sale at any market or sale in Zone II authorised under this Order may be moved from such landing-place to other premises in the said borough, and thence to the market or sale, provided that the animal is accompanied during each such movement by a Movement Licence authorising the movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the said borough.
- (4.) An animal may be moved from any market or sale authorised under this Order only if accompanied by a Movement Licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the market or sale is situate, and only to a slaughter-house in Zone II, where the animal shall be detained until it is slaughtered.
- (5.) An animal exposed at a market or sale authorised under this Order shall not be moved therefrom unless before such movement it is marked, by and at the expense of the owner, in the manner described in Article 6 of Order (No. 3).

Continued Prohibition of Movement in Zone I; Special Provision for Movement into County Borough of Gateshead for Slaughter.
