# ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 6TH MARCH 1914.)

WORCESTERSHIRE DISTRICT AND (FOOT - AND - MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1914 (No. 3).

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1911, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

#### Modification of Existing Order.

1. The Worcestershire and District (Footand-Mouth Disease) Order of 1914 (No. 2), hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order," is modified in manner hereinafter appearing.

# Alteration of Zones I, II, and III.

2. The principal Order shall be read and have effect as if the Zones I, II, and III, described in the Schedule hereto, were respectively substituted for the Zones I, II, and III to which the principal Order refers, and the Scheduled District for the purposes of that Order shall comprise only the Zones I, II, and III, as described in the Schedule hereto.

#### Commencement.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the tenth day of March, nineteen hundred and fourteen.

### Short Title, &c.

4. This Order may be cited as the Worstershire and District (Foot-And-CESTERSHIRE AND Mouth Disease) Order of 1914 (No. 3), and shall be read with the principal Order.

## SCHEDULE.

#### ZONE I.

A Zone comprising such portions of the parishes of Hanbury, Stock and Bradley, and Feckenham, in the administrative county of Worcester, as lie within the following boundary, excluding any road, footpath, or lane which forms part of such boundary:—

Commencing at the guide post near Bradley Green Farm, in the main road from Droitwich to Alcester, and proceeding in a southerly direction along the main road (via Bradley) to its junction with the bridle road leading to Upper Hollowfields Farm, thence westerly following that bridle road to its junction with the parish road leading to Parkhall and Skirgens Farms, thence in a northerly direction along that road to the boundary hedge between Hollowfields and Parkhall Farm, thence in a westerly and northerly direction following that hedge, the footpath and the boundary hedge between Skirgens Farm and Park Farm to the main road from Droitwich to Alcester, thence in a north-easterly direction crossing that road to the building near the eastern side of the milestone (5 miles from Droit-wich), thence continuing in a north-easterly direction along the western side of that building and the fences in continuation thereof, to the bridle road leading from Forest Farm to the road from Woodgate to Feckenham, thence south-easterly along that bridle road and the last-mentioned road to the fence opposite the eastern end of Moat Farm buildings at the entrance to the footpath leading to Littleworth Farm, thence in a southerly direction along that fence and Perry Mill Lane to the main road from Droitwich to Alcester, thence south-easterly along that road to the point of commencement.

## ZONE II.

A Zone in the administrative county of Worcester comprising the following parishes and parts of parishes, but excluding such portions of the parishes of Stock and Bradley, Feckenham, and Hanbury, as are comprised in Zone I:-

The parishes of Inkberrow, Feekenham, Bentley Pauncefoot, Steek and Bradley,
