PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

**W**HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, chapter seventy-seven, of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and thirteen, and of the Act of the thirty-seventh and thirty-eighth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter sixty-three, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the fifth day of February, in the year one thousand nine hundred and fourteen, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, chapter seventy-seven, of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and thirteen, and of the Act of the thirty-seventh and thirty-eighth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter sixty-three, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the follow-

ing Scheme with respect to the three Archdeaconries of Hampstead, London, and Middlesex, in the Diocese of London, and to some of the Rural Deaneries within the said Archdeaconries of Hampstead and Middlesex.

“ Whereas it has been represented to us by the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Arthur Foley, Bishop of London, that the arrangements which are hereinafter recommended and proposed with respect to the said Archdeaconries of Hampstead, London and Middlesex and with respect to some of the Rural Deaneries within the Archdeaconries of Hampstead and Middlesex are desirable and should be carried into effect, and we are of opinion that the same may be properly carried into effect.

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Arthur Foley, Bishop of London (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and Episcopal Seal to this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that as from the day on which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, firstly a new rural deanery shall be formed within the said Archdeaconry of Hampstead and shall be named ‘ the Rural Deanery of Harrow,’ and shall comprise and consist of
