At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 9th day of March, 1914.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by section 26 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, after reciting that "whereas in some instances tithings, hamlets, chapels and other places or districts may be separated from the parishes or mother churches to which they belong, with great advantage, and places altogether extra-parochial may, in some instances, with advantage be annexed to parishes or districts to which they are contiguous, or be constituted separate parishes for ecclesiastical purposes," it is, amongst other things, enacted, "That when with respect to his own diocese it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, or when the Bishop of any diocese shall represent to the said Archbishop, that any such tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place or district within the diocese of such Archbishop, or the diocese of such Bishop, as the case may be, may be advantageously separated from any parish or mother church, and either be constituted a separate benefice by itself or be united to any other parish to which it may be more conveniently annexed, or to any other adjoining tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place or district, parochial or extra-parochial, so as

to form a separate parish or benefice, or that any extra-parochial place may with advantage be annexed to any parish to which it is contiguous, or be constituted a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes; and the said Archbishop or Bishop shall draw up a scheme in writing (the scheme of such Bishop to be transmitted to the said Archbishop for his consideration) describing the mode in which it appears to him that the alteration may best be effected, and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes, rent charges and other ecclesiastical dues, rates and payments, and in respect to patronage and rights to pews, may be made with justice to all parties interested; and if the patron or patrons of the benefice or benefices to be affected by such alteration shall consent in writing under his or their hands to such scheme, or to such modification thereof as the said Archbishop may approve, and the said Archbishop shall, on full consideration and inquiry, be satisfied with any such scheme, or modification thereof, and shall certify the same and such consent as aforesaid, by his report to His Majesty in Council, it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council to make an Order for carrying such scheme or modification thereof, as the case may be, into effect."

And whereas by section 8 of the Church Building Act, 1839, it is, amongst other things,

further enacted: "That when by any Order of His Majesty in Council, as aforesaid, a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes is constituted, the same shall, on registration thereof, and with the consent in writing of the Incumbent or Incumbents of the benefice or benefices to be thereby affected, become a perpetual curacy and benefice, and the minister thereof duly nominated and licensed thereto and his successors shall be a body politic and corporate, with perpetual succession, and may receive and take to himself and his successors all such lands, tenements, tithes, rents, charges and hereditaments as shall be granted unto him or them, and such perpetual curate shall thenceforth have, within the limits of the district parish formed under the Church Building Acts for the church of such perpetual curacy, sole and exclusive cure of souls, and shall not in anywise be subject to the control or interference of the Incumbent or Incumbents of the benefice or benefices to be affected by such Order, if he or they shall have consented to such Order as aforesaid.

And whereas the Right Reverend Edward Carr, Lord Bishop of Peterborough, hath made a representation in writing, dated the 24th day of February, 1913, to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, as follows:—

"I, the Right Reverend Edward Carr, Lord Bishop of Peterborough, do hereby represent unto your Grace that there is in the county of Leicester and my diocese of Peterborough, the rectory of Market Bosworth, to which belongs an ancient parochial chapelry known by the name of the chapelry or hamlet of Barlestone, and also part of a hamlet known as the hamlet of Osbastone, the several boundaries whereof are well known and defined.

"That the population (according to the Census of 1911) of the parish of Market Bosworth aforesaid (exclusive of the said chapelry or hamlets) is seven hundred and twenty-nine, and of the said hamlet of Barlestone, situate two and a half miles distant from Market Bosworth aforesaid, is one thousand and forty, and of the said hamlet of Osbastone three hundred and seven, some seventy of which are in Cadeby Ecclesiastical parish and two hundred and thirty-seven reside near Barlestone.

"That there is a church or chapel in the said hamlet of Barlestone which affords sufficient accommodation for the inhabitants of Barlestone, and the portion of Osbastone proposed to be annexed thereto, and that the said hamlet of Barlestone is treated as a separate and distinct parish for all civil purposes, and that baptisms, churchings and marriages have been for a long series of years and are now performed in the said church or chapel, and that the said chapelry has its own churchwardens, overseers and other parish officers, and is not in any way connected with the parish of Market Bosworth in respect of rates of any kind.

"That the portion of the population of Osbastone not in Cadeby Ecclesiastical parish have been accustomed to and do now attend the Services of Barlestone and are spiritually cared for by the curate in charge at Barlestone.

"That the net yearly income of the rectory of Market Bosworth exclusive of such portion of it as is by this Scheme intended to be annexed to the proposed perpetual curacy and benefice of Barlestone is £447 3s. 4d.

"That the benefice of Market Bosworth with

its chapelries or hamlets is liable to the sum of £45 by way of first fruits payable to the Governors of Queen Anne's Bounty, and also to the payment of the annual sum of £4 10s. to the said Governors by way of tenths.

"That it does not appear that any of the landowners or inhabitants of Market Bosworth or Barlestone or Osbastone possess any legal right by faculty or otherwise to the exclusive use or occupation of any pew or sitting within either of the said churches.

"That there is a parsonage house at Market Bosworth for the residence of the rector thereof and also a house known as The Parsonage at Barlestone, purchased for a curate's house, and which it is intended should be the parsonage house for the proposed new benefice of Barlestone.

"That the executors of the late James Bowers are the patrons of the said rectory and the Reverend Percy Harris Bowers is the rector thereof.

"That it appears to me that under the provisions of the Acts of Parliament of the first and second years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, cap. 106, and the second and third years of the same reign, cap. 49, the said chapelry of Barlestone, together with that part of the hamlet of Osbastone which is coloured green on the accompanying plan, may with advantage to the interests of religion be separated from the rectory of Market Bosworth and constituted a separate benefice.

"That pursuant to the directions contained in the twenty-sixth section of the first-mentioned Act, I, the said Lord Bishop, have drawn up a Scheme in writing annexed to this Representation, describing the mode in which it appears to me that the alteration above proposed may best be effected, and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes, rent charges and other ecclesiastical dues, rates and payments, and in respect to patronage and rights to pews, may be made with justice to all parties interested, and I do hereby submit the same to your Grace together with the consents in writing of the said patron and Incumbent to the intent that if your Grace may on full consideration and inquiry be satisfied with such Scheme you may certify the same and such consents as aforesaid to His Majesty in Council."

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop of Peterborough and the consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows:—

"SCHEME.

"That the said chapelry of Barlestone verged blue on the plan and the portion of the said hamlet of Osbastone which is coloured green on the accompanying map or plan shall be separated from the said rectory and parish church of Market Bosworth and be constituted a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes and a perpetual curacy and benefice by the name or style of 'The Perpetual Curacy of Barlestone,' of which the said church or chapel so situate within the same as aforesaid shall be the parish church.

"(2) That the proposed separate parish or benefice shall be subject to the same ecclesiastical jurisdiction as the said rectory of Market Bosworth and the Incumbent of the said separate parish and benefice shall have the

exclusive cure of souls within the same, and the rector of the rectory of Market Bosworth shall be discharged therefrom.

“(3) That two churchwardens shall be annually chosen as heretofore in and for such separate church and benefice, and every person so chosen shall be duly admitted and do all things pertaining to the office of churchwardens as to ecclesiastical matters within such separate parish or benefice.

“(4) That the house known as The Parsonage House at Barlestone shall belong to and be the house of residence for the Incumbent for the time being of the said church and benefice of Barlestone and the garden and land adjoining thereto, containing three acres two roods and thirty perches or thereabouts, shall belong thereto and the income thereof shall be received by such Incumbent.

“(5) That the surplice fees, dues, offerings and emoluments arising and accruing within the said hamlet or chapelry of Barlestone and within the said portion of the said hamlet of Osbastone which is coloured green on the annexed plan, together with the glebe lands, rent charges and other income and emoluments described in the Schedule hereunder written shall belong to and the income thereof be received by the Incumbent for the time being of the said church and benefice of Barlestone.

“(6) That the said proposed separate benefice of Barlestone shall not be charged with any portion of the sums due and payable by the rector of Market Bosworth as aforesaid to the Governors of Queen Anne’s Bounty for the first fruits and tenths.

“(7) That all persons inhabitants of Market Bosworth shall be entitled to resort to the parish church of Market Bosworth and be liable only to the repairs of their said church, and all persons inhabitants of Barlestone and of that portion of the hamlet of Osbastone which is coloured green on the enclosed plan shall be entitled to resort to the parish church or chapel of Barlestone and to be liable only to the repairs of such church.

“(8) That baptisms, churchings and marriages, according to the rites of the Established Church, shall be solemnized and performed in the church of the said proposed separate parish and benefice.

“(9) That the patronage and right of nominating or presenting an Incumbent to the said perpetual curacy of Barlestone shall be vested in the present patrons, their successors and assigns.

“SCHEDULE.

“FIRST PART.

“The modus of thirty-three pounds four shillings and three pence charged upon land comprised in the parish of Barlestone.

“A piece of land known as Woodyard Piece, situate in Barlestone, containing one acre three roods and thirty-three perches or thereabouts, now and for the past twenty years let at an annual rental of six pounds, coloured yellow on the plan.

“A close of land in Barlestone containing nine acres and thirty-six perches or thereabouts let as allotments at an annual rent of twenty-two pounds fifteen shillings and tenpence, also coloured yellow on the plan.

“The apportioned rent charge of fifty-four pounds sixteen shillings and ninepence upon lands being such part of Osbastone aforesaid

coloured green, particulars whereof are set out in the second part of the Schedule hereto.

“A close of land situate in the parish of Newbold Verdon, in the county of Leicester, containing six acres or thereabouts, now let at an annual rental of twelve pounds, also coloured yellow on the plan.

“One thousand pounds consolidated stock.

“The apportioned rent charge of two pounds thirteen shillings upon lands in Barton Fabis.

“The apportioned rent charge of three pounds eighteen shillings upon lands in Naneby.

“The sum of one hundred and sixty pounds on deposit at the London City and Midland Bank.

Bowers, being the patron or person entitled to present to the rectory of Market Bosworth with the chapelry of Barlestone and the hamlet of Osbastone, in the county of Leicester and diocese of Peterborough, do by this writing under my hand signify to your Grace my consent to the Scheme above proposed to your Grace by the Lord Bishop of Peterborough for separating the said chapelry or hamlet of Barlestone and the portion of the hamlet of Osbastone shown on the accompanying plan and thereon coloured green from the said rectory of Market Bosworth and to everything therein contained.

“ As witness my hand this fifth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and thirteen.

“ I, the Reverend Percy Harris Bowers, being the rector of the rectory of Market Bosworth, with the chapelry of Barlestone and the hamlet of Osbastone, in the county of Leicester and diocese of Peterborough, do by this writing under my hand signify to your Grace my consent to the Scheme above proposed to your Grace by the Lord Bishop of Peterborough for separating the said chapelry or hamlet of Barlestone and the portion of the hamlet of Osbastone shown on the accompanying plan and thereon coloured green from the said rectory of Market Bosworth and to everything therein contained.

“ As witness my hand this fifth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and thirteen.

And whereas the said Scheme hath been transmitted by the said Bishop to the said Archbishop for his consideration;

And whereas the said Archbishop, being satisfied with the said Scheme, hath certified the same and the consents aforesaid to His Majesty in Council by his Report, dated the 10th day of April, 1913.

“ We, the undersigned Randall Thomas, Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury, do hereby report to Your Majesty in Council.

“ That the Right Reverend Edward Carr, Lord Bishop of Peterborough, has represented unto us, amongst other things:

“ That there is in the county of Leicester and his diocese of Peterborough, the rectory of Market Bosworth, to which belongs an ancient parochial chapelry known by the name of the chapelry or hamlet of Barlestone and also part of a hamlet known as the hamlet of Osbastone.

“ That there is a church or chapel in the said hamlet of Barlestone which affords sufficient accommodation for the inhabitants of Barlestone and the portion of Osbastone proposed to be annexed thereto.

“ That there is a parsonage house at Market Bosworth for the residence of the rector thereof

and also a house known as the parsonage at Barlestone purchased for a curate's house, which it is intended should be the parsonage house for the proposed new benefice of Barlestone.

“ That it appears to the said Lord Bishop that under the provisions of the Pluralities Act, 1838, and the Church Building Act, 1839, the said chapelry of Barlestone, together with that part of the hamlet of Osbastone (more particularly delineated and coloured green on the plan annexed to the Scheme of the said Lord Bishop appended hereto) may with advantage to the interests of religion be separated from the rectory of Market Bosworth and constituted a separate benefice.

“ That pursuant to the directions contained in the twenty-sixth section of the said first-mentioned Act of Parliament the said Lord Bishop has drawn up a Scheme in writing describing the mode in which it appears to him that the alteration above proposed may best be effected and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithe rent charge and other ecclesiastical dues, rates, and payments, and in respect to patronage and rights to pews, may be made with justice to all parties interested, which Scheme, together with the consent thereto in writing of the Reverend Percy Harris Bowers, the patron or person entitled to present to the said rectory of Market Bosworth, with the chapelry of Barlestone and the hamlet of Osbastone, and also as the rector of the same benefice, has been transmitted to us for our consideration.

“ The Representation and Scheme of the said Lord Bishop and the consent before referred to are hereunto annexed.

“ And we, the said Archbishop, being on full consideration and inquiry satisfied with the said Scheme, do hereby, pursuant to the said Pluralities Act, 1838, certify the same, and such consent as aforesaid, to your Majesty in Council, to the intent that your Majesty in Council may, in case your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do, make and issue an Order for carrying the said Scheme into effect. And we do further recommend that the house known as the Parsonage House, at Barlestone aforesaid, shall belong to and be the house of residence for the incumbent for the time being of the said church and benefice of Barlestone, and the garden and land adjoining thereto, containing three acres two roods and thirty perches or thereabouts, shall belong thereto, and the income thereof shall be received by such incumbent, and also that the surplice fees, dues, offerings, and emoluments arising and accruing within the said hamlet or chapelry of Barlestone and within the said portion of the said hamlet of Osbastone which is coloured green on the beforementioned plan, together with the glebe lands, rent charges, and other income and emoluments described in the schedule written at the foot or end of the said Scheme shall belong to and the income thereof be received by the incumbent for the time being of the said church and benefice of Barlestone.

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the said Scheme be carried into effect.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by section 21 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, after reciting that "Whereas from the increase of population, or from other circumstances, it may be expedient that two or more benefices which have been heretofore united, or which may be hereafter united, under the provisions of this Act should be disunited," it is, amongst other things, enacted "that when two or more benefices shall have been united, or may be hereafter united into one benefice, and with respect to his own diocese it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, or the Bishop of any diocese shall represent to the said Archbishop of the Province, that one or more of the benefices within his diocese, of which such united benefice shall consist, may be separated therefrom with advantage to the interests of religion, the said Archbishop shall inquire into the circumstances of the case, and if, on such inquiry, it shall appear to him that such union may be usefully dissolved, so far as respects such benefice or benefices, he shall, six weeks at least before certifying such inquiry to His Majesty as hereinafter directed, cause, with respect to his own diocese a statement in writing of the facts, and in all other cases a copy in writing of the aforesaid representation to be affixed on or near the principal outer door of the church or in some public and conspicuous place in each of the benefices forming part of the united benefice, with notice to any person or persons interested that he, she, or they may, within such six weeks, show cause in writing under his, her, or their hands to the said Archbishop against any such disunion, and, if no sufficient cause be shown within such time, the Archbishop shall certify the inquiry and consent, when the patron's consent is necessary, to His Majesty in Council, and thereupon it shall be lawful for His Majesty to issue an Order for separating such last-mentioned benefice or benefices from such united benefice, and for declaring the rights of patronage of the several patrons, if there be more than one patron, and such Order shall be registered in the Registry of the diocese to which such united benefice shall belong, which Order the Registrar of such diocese, immediately on the receipt thereof, is hereby required to register accordingly, and thereupon immediately, if such united benefice shall be then vacant, otherwise on the first avoidance thereof, such union shall be ipso facto dissolved, so far only as regards such benefice or benefices so proposed to be separated from such united benefice, but in all other respects shall remain in full force and effect, and thenceforward such last-mentioned benefice or benefices shall be and be deemed and taken to be a separate and distinct benefice or benefices to all intents and purposes whatever as if no such union had taken place, and the patron or patrons thereof shall and may according to the terms of such Order present or nominate thereto respectively, and so, from time to time, upon each and every avoidance of the same: Provided always, that no benefices which have been united for more than sixty years before the passing of this Act shall be disunited without the consent in writing of the patron or patrons thereof."

And whereas by section 23 of the said Act it is further enacted that "whenever two or more benefices which have at any time been united into one benefice shall be disunited and become separate benefices under the provisions of this Act, whether the Order for disunion shall extend to the whole number of benefices of which such united benefice consisted or to one or more of such benefices only, it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council, on the recommendation of the Archbishop of the Province with the consent of the patron or patrons of such benefices respectively (such consent to be signified in writing under the hands of such patron or patrons) to assign and attach such portion of the glebe lands, tithes, moduses, rent-charges or other endowments or emoluments belonging to or arising or accruing within the limits of such united benefice to each of such benefices respectively as to His Majesty in Council shall seem fit notwithstanding such proportion of glebe lands, tithes, rent-charges, moduses, or other endowments or emoluments, or any part thereof, may not arise or accrue within the limits of the benefice to which the same shall be so assigned and attached as aforesaid, or may not have belonged thereto, and also to divide and apportion between such benefices all such charges and outgoings as before the disunion thereof were imposed upon the whole united benefice."

And whereas the Right Reverend Edward Lee, Lord Bishop of Lincoln, hath made a representation in writing, dated the 8th day of March, 1913, to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, as follows:—

"I, Edward Lee, Bishop of Lincoln, do hereby represent to your Grace that it appears to me that the disunion of the united benefice consisting of the vicarage of Burgh and the vicarage of Winthorpe, in the county and my diocese of Lincoln by the separation of the said vicarage of Winthorpe from the said vicarage of Burgh may be made with advantage to the interests of religion.

"EDWARD LINCOLN."

And whereas, on the 14th day of March, 1913, the said Archbishop inquired into the circumstances of the case;

And whereas, on the 20th day of June, 1913, the said Archbishop certified to His Majesty in Council as follows, that is to say:—

"We, the undersigned, Randall Thomas, Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury, Primate of all England and Metropolitan, do hereby certify to our Majesty in Council,

"That the Right Reverend Edward Lee, Lord Bishop of Lincoln, as Bishop of the diocese, in which is situate the united benefice consisting of the vicarage of Burgh and the vicarage of Winthorpe, in the county of Lincoln, having represented unto us that the disunion of the said united benefice by the separation of the vicarage of Winthorpe from the vicarage of Burgh may be made with advantage to the interests of religion, we inquired into the circumstances of the case.

"That on such inquiry it appeared to us that such union might usefully be dissolved, and that the said Lord Bishop, by virtue of his bishopric, being the patron or person entitled

to present to the said united benefice of Burgh with Winthorpe if the same were now vacant consents as such patron to the proposed disunion.

"That six weeks and upwards before certifying such inquiry and consent to Your Majesty in Council we caused a copy in writing of the aforesaid Representation of the said Lord Bishop to be affixed to the principal outer doors of each of the parish churches of Burgh and Winthorpe with notice to any person or persons interested that he, she or they might within such six weeks show cause in writing under his, her or their hand or hands to us, the said Archbishop, but no such cause has been shown.

"The Representation of the said Lord Bishop of Lincoln, our inquiry into the circumstances of the case, the statement of circumstances in reply thereto, the consent in writing of the said Lord Bishop as patron of the said united benefice and the copies of the Representation and notices before mentioned are hereto annexed.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in

them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1911, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Withdrawal of Existing Orders.

1. The provisions of the Durham and Northumberland (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1914 and the Durham and Northumberland (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Orders of 1914 (Nos. 3, 4, and 5) shall cease to operate, and instead of those provisions the following provisions shall take effect.

Prohibition of Movement out of Certain Area.

2. No cattle, sheep, goats, or swine shall be moved out of the Area described in the Schedule hereto: Provided that nothing in this Article shall be deemed to apply to the movement of animals out of such Area where they are moved through such Area by railway from a place outside such Area to another place outside such Area without unnecessary delay and without the animals being untrucked within such Area.

Local Authority to Enforce Order.

3. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

4. If an animal is moved in contravention of this Order the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the animal, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the animal is moved shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Commencement.

5. This Order shall come into operation on the twentieth day of March, nineteen hundred and fourteen.

Short Title, &c.

6. This Order may be cited as the DURHAM AND NORTHUMBERLAND (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1914 (No. 6).

1914 (No. 5).

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1911, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

Modification of Orders.

1. The Liverpool and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1914, and the Liverpool and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Orders of 1914 (Nos. 3 and 4), hereinafter referred to as "the existing Orders," are modified in manner hereinafter appearing.

Alteration of Zones I, II and III.

2. The existing Orders shall be read and have effect as if the Zones I, II and III, described in the Schedule hereto, were respectively substituted for the Zones I, II and III to which the existing Orders refer.

Provision for Movement of Animals within Zone I for immediate Slaughter.

3. An animal may be moved from premises in Zone I to any slaughterhouse in that Zone if accompanied by a Movement Licence authorising such movement, granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the first mentioned premises are situate, and if the animal before the movement is commenced is marked, by and at the expense of the owner, in the manner described in Article 6 of Order (No. 3).

Holding of Markets and Sales of Animals for Immediate Slaughter in Zone I.

4.—(1.) Notwithstanding any provision contained in the existing Orders, a market or sale of animals may be held in Zone I in accordance with the following provisions:—

(i) The market or sale shall be restricted to animals intended for immediate slaughter

which have been brought from premises situate outside the Scheduled District under and in accordance with the subsequent provisions of this Article, and the market or sale must be authorised by the Local Authority under this Article.

(ii) The Local Authority shall cause a Veterinary Inspector to attend at every market or sale authorised under this Article and examine the animals exposed thereat.

(2.) An animal may be moved without a licence by railway or by vessel from premises not situate within any District which is for the time being a Scheduled District for the purposes of an Order of the Board relating to Foot-and-Mouth Disease to a railway station or landing-place situate within Zone I; and an animal so moved may be moved from the railway station or landing-place to any market or sale in Zone I authorised under this Article if accompanied by a Movement Licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the railway station or landing-place is situate.

(3.) An animal may be moved from any market or sale authorised under this Article only if accompanied by a Movement Licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the market or sale is situate, and only to a slaughterhouse in Zone I, where the animal shall be detained until it is slaughtered.

(4.) An animal exposed at a market or sale authorised under this Article shall not be moved therefrom unless before such movement it is marked, by and at the expense of the owner, in the manner described in Article 6 of Order (No. 3).

Movement of Animals into Zone I for Immediate Slaughter.

5. For Article 5 of Order (No. 3) the following Article shall be substituted:—

"5.—(1.) An animal may, subject as hereinafter provided, be moved without a licence by railway or by vessel from premises in Zone III or from premises not situate within any District which is for the time being a Scheduled District for the purposes of an Order of the Board relating to Foot-and-Mouth Disease, to a railway station or landing-place situate within Zone I; and an animal so moved may be moved from the railway station or landing-place to any slaughterhouse situate within Zone I if accompanied by a Movement Licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the railway station or landing-place is situate.

(2.) An animal may, subject as hereinafter provided, also be moved from any premises situate within the Zone II or Zone III to any slaughterhouse situate within Zone I, if accompanied by a Movement Licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the first mentioned premises are situate.

(3.) Nothing in this Article or in the preceding Articles shall be deemed to authorise the landing of cattle, sheep, goats or swine brought from Ireland."

General Provisions as to Movement.

6. Animals while being moved under this Order shall, so far as is practicable, be kept separate from all animals which are not being so moved, and shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay to the place of destination specified in the Licence, and where the place of destination is a slaughterhouse they shall be there detained until they are slaughtered.

Provisions as to Licences.

7.—(1.) Where animals are moved with a Licence under this Order the Licence shall forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered up to an officer of the Local Authority or be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station in the same District by the person in charge of the animals at the time of completing the movement.

(2.) A copy of a Licence which authorises movement to premises in a District other than the District for which the person granting the Licence acts as Inspector shall forthwith be sent by the Inspector to the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination is situate.

Commencement.

8. This Order shall come into operation on the twentieth day of March, nineteen hundred and fourteen.

Short Title, &c.

9. This Order may be cited as the LIVERPOOL AND DISTRICT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1914 (No. 5), and shall be read with the existing Orders.

Locomotives Act, 1898.

ADDITIONAL BY-LAW.

NOTICE is hereby given, that the London County Council intends, after the expiration of one calendar month from the date of the publication of this notice, to apply to the Local Government Board for the confirmation of the following additional by-law (in substitution for the additional by-laws specified in the notice published on 12th August, 1913) for regulating the use of locomotives and of waggons drawn by locomotives within the County of London (exclusive of the City of London):—

A person in charge of a locomotive drawing any loaded or unloaded waggon or waggons shall not cause or suffer the locomotive to travel on any highway without having (1) a cord or other efficient means of communication extending from the rearmost waggon to such locomotive, and (2) a person who shall (except during the time it is necessary for him to leave his position in order to comply with any statutory regulation or by-law relating to the use of locomotives on highways) travel in the rear of such waggon or waggons. Such last-mentioned person shall signal to the driver of such locomotive to stop or drive to the side of the highway when it shall be necessary to do so in order to enable overtaking pedestrians, vehicles, horses or cattle to pass by. And the person in charge of such locomotive shall, upon receiving any such signal as aforesaid, immediately stop such locomotive and waggon or waggons, or draw them to the side of the highway as the case may require.

Provided always that this by-law shall not apply—

(a) to a steam roller not drawing more than three loaded or unloaded waggons; or

(b) to any locomotive drawing not more than one loaded or unloaded waggon, if such locomotive or waggon, or any load or loads carried thereon, do not obstruct the view by the person driving the locomotive of overtaking traffic.

The said by-law will be deposited at the County Hall, Spring Gardens, Charing Cross, for one calendar month from and after the publication of this notice, and, before application for confirmation is made as aforesaid, will be open during office hours thereat to the inspection of the ratepayers of the district to which such by-law relates, without fee or reward.
