And whereas the Neath and Briton Ferry Hospital Committee is an Authority whose Accounts are subject to be audited by a District Auditor, and it is desirable that the duty of auditing the Accounts of the said Committee and of their Officers be assigned to the said John Evan Pughe Jones:

NOW THEREFORE, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We hereby Order and Prescribe that it shall, until We otherwise Prescribe, be the duty of the said John Evan Pughe Jones to audit the Accounts of the said Committee and of their Officers, in conformity with the provisions contained in Article II of the above-cited Order; and that for the purpose of such Audit the Neath and Briton Ferry Hospital District shall be deemed to be within the said South Wales Audit District.

#### ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 20TH MARCH 1914.)

#### CAMBRIDGE ALLOTMENT GARDENS (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF 1914.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1911, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. Article 3 of the Cambridge Allotment Gardens (Swine-Fever) Order of 1908 is hereby revoked and the following provisions substituted therefor:—

*"Movement of Swine from Premises to which this Order applies.*

3.—(1.) Swine (not being in a Swine-Fever Infected Place and their movement not being prohibited by Notice of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board given under any Order of the Board) may be moved from any premises to which this Order applies under and in accordance with the following provisions.

(2.) Swine may be moved to any slaughter-house for the purpose of immediate slaughter if accompanied by a licence in the Form D set forth in the First Schedule

to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 (authorising such movement, granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the borough of Cambridge.

(3.) Before a licence (Form D) is granted by an Inspector under this Article the owner of the swine, or his agent authorised in writing for this purpose, shall sign, and deliver or send by post to the Inspector a declaration in the Form E set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, which shall be retained by the Inspector.

(4.) The swine shall, before the movement is commenced, be marked by and at the expense of the owner by the painting with an indelible composition of red colour of a broad line down the back and another broad line across the loins of each of the swine thus +, each line being not less than nine inches long.

(5.) Swine may also be moved from any premises to which this Order applies to any other premises, not being situate in a Scheduled Area to which the Swine-Fever (Special Areas) Order of 1911 applies, if accompanied by a licence in the Form A set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 authorising such movement, granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination specified in the licence is situate, but no such licence shall be expressed to be granted for movement for breeding purposes.

(6.) Before a licence (Form A) is granted by an Inspector under this Article, the owner of the swine, or his agent authorised in writing for this purpose, shall sign and deliver or send by post to the Inspector, a declaration in the Form B set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, countersigned as hereinafter provided.

(7.) The declaration (Form B) shall not be effective until it is countersigned by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the borough of Cambridge, who, before countersigning the declaration, shall, so far as is practicable, satisfy himself as to the correctness of the statements contained therein.

(8.) The declaration (Form B) shall be retained by the Inspector granting the licence thereon.

(9.) Swine moved with a licence (Form A) under this Article shall not, for a period of twenty-eight days after arrival at the place of destination specified in the licence, be moved from such place of destination, except as hereinafter provided.

(10.) Where swine are moved with a licence (Form A) to a market, fairground or saleyard, specified in the licence, the swine shall be moved from such premises only if accompanied by a licence in the Form C set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, authorising such movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the
