

And whereas the North Bucks Smallpox Isolation Hospital Joint Committee is an Authority whose Accounts are subject to be audited by a District Auditor, and it is desirable that the duty of auditing the Accounts of the said Joint Committee and of their Officers be assigned to the said George Langford Gibson:

NOW, THEREFORE, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We hereby Order and Prescribe that it shall, until We otherwise Prescribe, be the duty of the said George Langford Gibson to audit the Accounts of the said Joint Committee and of their Officers, in conformity with the provisions contained in Article II of the above-cited Order; and that for the purpose of such Audit the area within which the powers, authorities, and jurisdiction of the said Joint Committee may be exercised shall be deemed to be within the said Northamptonshire Audit District.

#### ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 3RD APRIL 1914.)

#### LIVERPOOL AND DISTRICT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1914 (No. 8).

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1911, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

##### *Modification of Order.*

1. The Liverpool and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1914 (No. 7), hereinafter referred to as the principal Order, is modified in manner hereinafter appearing.

*Movement into and within Zone I for any necessary or expedient purpose.*

2. Notwithstanding the provisions of the principal Order an animal may be moved to any premises in Zone I from any premises in that Zone or from outside that Zone if an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the premises from which the animal is moved are situate considers such movement to be necessary or expedient and authorises the movement by a Movement Licence.

##### *Markets in Zone I.*

3. Markets or sales authorised under the principal Order to be held in Zone I shall be open to animals moved from Zone II if intended for immediate slaughter and moved with a licence under the preceding Article authorising such movement.

*Free Movement into and within Zone II; Restrictions on Movement out of such Zone.*

4.—(1) The provisions of Part III of the principal Order (*Provisions as to Zone II*) shall cease to operate.

(2) No animal shall be moved out of Zone II except to premises in Zone I and under and in accordance with a licence granted under the principal Order or this Order.

##### *Regulation of Markets, etc., in Zone II.*

5. The provisions of Article 11 of the principal Order shall take effect as if Zone II were therein substituted for Zone III.

##### *Withdrawal of Restrictions from Zone III.*

6. The provisions of the principal Order which relate or refer to Zone III shall cease to apply to that Zone and that Zone shall cease to form part of the Scheduled District.

##### *Commencement.*

7. This Order shall come into operation on the seventh day of April, nineteen hundred and fourteen.

##### *Short Title, &c.*

8. This Order may be cited as the LIVERPOOL AND DISTRICT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1914 (No. 8), and shall be read with the Order referred to in Article 1.
